The Advent of Jesus

The word "advent" means "arrival," or "coming" and it refers to the arrival of Jesus Christ into the world. The "Advent season" usually starts four weeks before Christmas and concludes with the celebration of Christ's birth.

Some churches emphasize the Advent season more than others, but all Christians look forward to Christ's birth during this season of the year. And why not, since the coming of Jesus Christ into the world is at the center of our faith? Even people who aren't religious divide their calendar into two parts -- the centuries before Christ's birth ("B.C.") and the centuries afterward ("A.D.," or "after the Lord").

Christmas is more than the birthday of a great man. The Bible tells us that Christmas marks the entrance into the world of the divine Son of God, sent from heaven to save us from our sins. Jesus Christ was God in human flesh -- fully man, but also fully God. The Bi-

ble says, "In Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form" (Colossians 2:9). Many have the idea that our good works can save us and get us into Heaven, but the Bible says this isn't so:

"As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:" (Rom. 3:10)

"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;" (Rom. 3:23)

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." (Eph. 2:8-9)

We have no really "good" works, because we're all SINNERS by nature. We were born into this world as sinners (Psa. 51:5), and this is why Jesus said we must be "born again" (John. 3:3).

This new birth is given to us freely, and was made possible when Christ died and shed His blood at Calvary for our sins. By receiving Jesus Christ as your Savior, trusting Him alone to save you, you can be born again. You can have eternal life TODAY by faith in Jesus Christ. Romans 10:13 says, "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." Romans 10:9-10 says, "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation."

How do we prepare for the coming of Jesus the Christ?

- The Bible teaches that the return of Jesus Christ is imminent. Throughout the gospels Jesus is quoted as saying that no one, not even he, knows the day or the hour of his return, that his coming will be at a time when he is not expected, and that believers should keep watch and be ready. The imminent return of Jesus Christ built expectation in generations of believers, who were comforted that soon they might be delivered from the cares and tribulations of this world.
- To be ready, a believer should be living a life of faith in Jesus Christ, seeking the fullness of the spirit of God and growing in discipleship.
- The expectation of the return of Jesus Christ has been termed, "The blessed hope." The New Testament speaks of the fact that persons who have this hope and expectation of the coming of Christ purify themselves in their anticipation.

As we enter the season of Advent and the coming of the Lord Jesus, who is the Christ, there is cause for concern all around us, for Jesus signals Peace, Love and Justice. The question is, where is the peace that we yearn for? The Angel sang: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men". (Lk.2:14). The world today is in crisis. There is the economic, political and financial crisis. There are demonstrations everywhere and many regimes have been removed by people power. Thousands of people have died in the upheavals across North Africa and the Middle East. There are suicide bombings in Pakistan, Afghanistan, Iraq and Palestine. Security has been tightened all around us and there is uncertainty everywhere. The peace anticipated for decades between Israel and Palestine is still a dream.

Hunger, drought and deadly diseases operate like plagues upon the land. On the other hand, there are persons who have billions of dollars and pay no concern to the rest of society. Where is the justice in our land, when the rich gets richer and the poor gets poorer? If there is genuine love for one another, we would ensure that there is bread for each person. It cannot be that some eat bread, while others have to settle for the crumbs that fall from the table. If Advent means anything to us, it must mean that Jesus the Christ, is going to make a difference in how we live and treat each other. The words of the song writer in *O come, O Come, Emmanuel* is very appropriate in our times. Allow the words to resonate as you read or sing them:

*O come, O come, Emmanuel
And ransom captive Israel
That mourns in lonely exile here
Until the Son of God appear
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
Shall come to thee, O Israel.*

*O come, Thou Rod of Jesse, free
Thine own from Satan's tyranny
From depths of Hell Thy people save
And give them victory o'er the grave
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
Shall come to thee, O Israel*

*O come, Thou Day-Spring, come and cheer
Our spirits by Thine advent here
Disperse the gloomy clouds of night
And death's dark shadows put to flight.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
Shall come to thee, O Israel.*

Take time between now and Christmas to reflect on this great truth of the coming of Jesus.. Read passages from the Old Testament that predicted His coming (often in startling detail); read, too, the opening chapters of Matthew and Luke that tell of the events surrounding His birth. Then thank God every day for the greatest gift we could ever receive: the gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ.

After she retired, she was rehired to teach disabled children for a further Ten (10) Years. She has helped over sixty (60) children. Presently she is engaged in the teaching of Sunday School and Confirmation Classes at Potters Zion Moravian Church in Antigua. Teaching has been and continues to be her passion and her life.



Bro. Clarence Edwards— Honouree from the Antigua Conference, had an illustrious Teaching career which spanned thirty-one (31) years from 1945-1976. He progressed from pupil teacher to certified teacher, then he became headmaster from 1961 and functioned in that capacity at three schools respectively. He later became Principal in the Secondary school from 1968. Bro. Edwards has been serving the Moravian Church for over forty years. He served as secretary to the B.O.S and B.O.E., delegate to Island Conference, Lay reader and Acolyte, delegate to Synod and chairperson for John E. Knight Golden age Home.

Sis. Trudy Kerr Honouree—from the Trinidad Conference has taught Spanish and French for thirty-six (36) years. She was head of her Department. She was also Vice Principal and Principal respectively. Sis. Kerr organized prayers from September 1990—May 2005. She was involved in youth Group, a Church Elder and also taught Sunday School.



Sis. Ruth Olive Francis Limerick— Honouree—from the Antigua Conference began her teaching career on July 1st, 1954. Her



first teaching assignment was at the Swetes Primary School where she taught all the core subjects. In 1970 she worked at the All Saints Secondary School for 10 years as a Graduate Teacher after which she was appointed Principal of the Pares Secondary School for another 10 years. After she retired, she was employed as a Supervisor of the Adult Continuing Education Evening Institute where she spent 6 years and 10 months. Teacher Ruth was involved in all aspects of the Cana Moravian Church. She believes
