

For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of sound mind. (2 Tim. 1:7.)



All of us need to learn to stand up on our own two feet. As Christians, given a new identity in the Lord, as more than a conqueror and given a spirit of power, love and a sound mind, we should all learn to stand up for what **really** matters (see Romans 8:37; 2 Timothy 1:7)

STANDING UP

The Bible tells us that our life as Christ-followers requires learning to stand up on our own two feet. It begins in repentance and ends in each of us giving an account of our lives before the Lord on the Day of Judgment (see Romans 14:12). We all need to learn to stand up and take our stand in all matters of life.

WE ARE IN A WAR

We are given a choice to either join God's side through Jesus Christ or the enemy's side by not standing up for Jesus. Let us face it – there is no middle ground in this life we have. It is either we are for God or against God.

Some might say that I am exaggerating things, but I am merely speaking spiritual truth. It is either we do the will of God – which is good, pleasing and perfect – or we don't do the will of God.

IT IS A PERSONAL CHOICE

Because we are in a war, we should learn to make our own choices. We cannot rely on our pastor to make decisions for us. We cannot rely on our pastor to pull us up to a better relationship with God. - Your growth in your relationship with God is a product of your prayer times, Bible reading, and obedience;
- Your decision to avoid sinning will be your own, even though others will be helping you;
- You alone will give an account to God for all the words you have said and the life that you have lived.

STAND UP

Friend, I encourage you, let us all learn to stand up on our own two feet, dependent only on the Lord for His strength, wisdom and guidance. We all have a role to play in this generation where God has put us in. In time such as this (see Esther 4:14), let us give Him glory – personally.

This Month in Moravian History'

"Christian Ignatius LaTrobe (1758-1836)"



This month marks the 182nd anniversary of the death of the Moravian clergyman, musician and composer, Christian Ignatius LaTrobe on May 6, 1836. He served the Church in a variety of ways as a talented man from a talented family. His father, Benjamin LaTrobe, was

superintendent of the Moravian Church in England. His mother, Anna Margarette Antes, was the sister of John Antes, gifted American composer and instrument maker. His brother, Benjamin Henry LaTrobe, a renowned architect, designed the United States Capitol.

Christian Ignatius LaTrobe was born on February 12, 1758, at the Moravian settlement, Fulneck, in Yorkshire, England, where he attended school before entering the Moravian boys' school in Niesky, Germany, in 1771. After graduating he remained at Niesky as a teacher before returning to England in 1784. Three years later he was appointed secretary to the Society for the Furtherance of the Gospel, a position he held for 50 years until his retirement in 1834. His son John remarked, "It is rare to meet with an instance in which a man is so exactly fitted to the position he is appointed to occupy." His father was perfect as secretary since he had an "earnest desire to be an instrument for the advancement of Christ's kingdom, yet with no decided predilection for the Christian ministry." In 1796 LaTrobe was appointed secretary of the Moravian Church in England, and began publishing the missions magazine, Periodical Accounts. missions administrator he translated History of the Mission of the United Brethren Among the Indians in North America by Loskiel from German into English in 1794. In 1815 LaTrobe made an official visit to the Moravian missions in South Africa, where he planned the founding of a new mission station named Enon. Besides publishing an account of his trip, he also started writing his posthumously published Letters to My Children (1851), a collection of essays on a variety of topics, including the abolition of slavery and his thoughts on church music.

LaTrobe was not only a gifted administrator, but also an accomplished musician and composer. In fact, he was the only Moravian composer to receive wide recognition outside the church in his lifetime. He recalled, "From my earliest infancy, every kind of musical sound immediately attracted my attention." He thanked God for his "genius for music," as he played the violin, viola, violoncello, oboe, French horn, trumpet, trombone, bassoon, clarinet and double bass, besides the organ and pianoforte. During his school days LaTrobe described his musical taste as "bad ... the noble simplicity of our church music and hymn tunes was lost in flourishes and ill-placed decorations, and deformed by long straggling interludes."

Through the intervention Bishop Spangenberg LaTrobe switched to a simpler musical style where he strove "not to disturb, but to further the devotion of the congregation." In a collection of Moravian hymn tunes compiled for English audiences, LaTrobe stressed simplicity as the "grand source of beauty in church music" which enables one to "feel His divine presence with us." He lamented the "prevalence of depravity" (i.e. loud and showy instrumentation) which disturbed the connection to Christ. LaTrobe was a close friend of Franz Joseph Haydn, whom he visited often when the latter visited England. LaTrobe dedicated three piano sonatas to Haydn, in addition to composing clarinet concertos, duets and arias, and more than a hundred vocal pieces. www.moravianchurcharchives.org




The first measures of a tune, composed by LaTrobe, as printed in the tune book he edited (1791).

It's Mango season! Why not enjoy this lovely fruit in various forms.

FIVE INGREDIENT MANGO GUMMY BEAR

Delicious gummy bears made from all-natural ingredients.

No added preservatives or additives.

Prep time: 15 mins	Cook time: 1 hr	Ready in: 1 hr, 15 mins
--------------------	-----------------	-------------------------

Serves 6.

Ingredients

- 1 large Mango
- 1/4th cup of Orange Juice
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice freshly squeezed
- 1 to 2 tablespoons granulated sugar adjust to taste
- 3 tablespoons unflavoured gelatin powder

Instructions

- 1. Chop the mango and add it to a blender. Add orange juice and sugar. Blend until smooth.
- 2. Place all ingredients in a saucepan and place on low heat. When the mixture is slightly warm, add in the gelatin and whisk continuously until it has dissolved completely. If a few gelatin lumps form, use a spoon to take them out.
- 3. Pour the hot liquid into a silicon mould, making sure to run the back if a knife over it to end out the liquid in the bear moulds.
- 4. Refrigerate for at least an hour. The gummy bears are ready when they are no longer sticky and feel firm to touch.
- 5. To take out the gummy bears flip the silicon mould on a clean surface and gently push out the gummy bears.

Feel free to use whatever mould you have. They look cute in all sorts of shapes. If you don't have a mould you can just put the jelly liquid into a dish and cut out shapes when the jelly is set.

When we look around we realise that if life has other names - it is **TROUBLE**, it is **LONELINESS** and **ALIENATION**, it is **SICKNESS** and **PAIN**, it is **'GETTING DOWN IN SPIRIT'** from time to time, it is **FINANCIAL NEED**, it is **FEAR** and **ANXIETY**, it is **'HAVING A BAD ATTITUDE'**. **Sometimes it is feeling that there is no way out.**

EXTRACT:

TWENTY-TWO HELPFUL THOUGHTS ON REARING CHILDREN FOR GOD.



The goal as Christian parents is not to rear a "good kid" or have students who are excelling academically, are great athletes, and so forth, it is to train and equip our children to stay on the road of usefulness to God, to love and serve Him.

- 1. Make sure to encourage your children to read biographies and autobiographies of Christians of the past. It helps them to see how God had worked in other Christians' lives.
- 2. Make sure your children hear you pray, and in your prayer let them hear you calling their name to God. It teaches your children how to pray.
- 3. Make sure you show your children how to do personal devotions and that they see you read the Bible and do personal devotions. Make sure you read and explain the Bible to your children. Your personal, intimate, and real spiritual relationship with God will be the most important influence in rearing your children for God. The second will be conveying to your children the way to have that relationship and for them to have an intimate, personal, passionate relationship with the Lord.
- **4.** You must **pray for your child's heart daily** (*Proverbs 23:26*) and work at it. Part of getting their heart is to ask questions. You must make time to communicate. You must draw out what is in the heart. Remember that if you lose your child's heart, find out where you lost it and make every effort to get it back as soon as possible. Your child's heart can be lost, hardened, and stolen.
- 5. Make sure you put God first in your life and your giving; explain that all money is God's money, not just 10 percent. Make sure that you explain giving to the Lord to your children, and that your children see you give to the Lord. As your children are given money or work for money, make sure they understand that giving begins at an early age.
- **6.** Make sure your children see you submit yourself to the Holy Spirit. Encourage them to submit themselves to the Holy Spirit. As the Lord works in your life, it does not hurt the children to see you come forward in a service and submit yourself more fully to God.

TWENTY-TWO HELPFUL THOUGHTS ON REARING CHILDREN FOR GOD CONT'D

- 7. Make sure you share your personal testimony of salvation with your children. Tell them how you got saved. Pray earnestly for your children to be saved and make sure they understand the gospel. Seek to see your children come to know Christ at an early age.
- **8.** Make sure your children see you give out gospel tracts to others. Take them on visitation with you.
- **9.** Make sure your children hear you give a clear presentation of the gospel to an unsaved person. Teach your children how to give that presentation.
- 10. Make sure your children hear you tell others how much your local Church means to you. Make sure they understand the importance of faithful church attendance.
- 11. Make sure your children hear you and your spouse tell each other that you love each other.
- 12. Make sure your children hear you express gratitude to God for His blessing in your life and family
- **13.** Make sure you tell your children you love them often and consistently.
- 14. Make sure you explain Bible truth to your children and make practical application of that truth in the daily activities of life.
- **15.** Make sure you explain the great doctrinal truths of the Bible to your children. It is very important to explain how the Holy Spirit works in your life. Explain what it means to be filled (controlled by the Holy Spirit).
- 16. Make sure the emphasis of the church is on teaching spiritual truth to you and your family, upon growing spiritually, winning the lost, and not merely activity orientated or an overall emphasis on music instead of God's Word.
- 17. Make sure you are the most important influence in your young child's life guard them from (negative) worldly television influences, worldly music, and worldly peer and ungodly friendship influences. Make sure to not allow your children to start concentrating on the opposite sex at too early an age.
- 18. Make sure your life is a testimony of holiness not only at Church but home as well.



- 19. Make sure your children are exposed to education in a Biblical, Godly, Christian, wholesome atmosphere.
- 20. Make sure you are seeking to develop godly Christian character in your children's

lives by proper discipline. A child must learn to obey the first time. A child must learn to never have to be told more than once to obey. Make sure to discipline correctly and consistently. Make sure you, as a parent, pay attention and work at proper discipline. It is your responsibility to teach your child how to concentrate. Make sure you always discipline improper attitude and reaction.

- 21. Make sure that you are not living your life daily in ungodly anger, or the spirit of anger (Ephesians 4:31-32). Understand that the Bible says ungodly anger comes from pride, Proverbs 21:24. Many Christians are operating in their life daily under the impression they are in fellowship with God and in reality they are running their life in sinful anger out of fellowship with God, 1 John 1:6-10. Ungodly anger is deceptive, Galatians 6:7-8. By doing this, we open up our life to the devil and his destruction, 1 Peter 5:8. This destruction takes place in our lives, in the lives of our family, and of our children. The essence of the Christian life is to be controlled by the Spirit of God, Ephesians 5:18. Make sure you understand that "love is kind", 1 Corinthians 13:4.
- 22. Make sure you understand that you have to develop Godly character in the lives of your children. The Bible gives at least 49 different character traits. The devil will get interested in their character, and your character. He does not care about you or your children. He has three desires to "steal, kill, and to destroy", John 10:9-10. Realize you are fighting the devil for your children, 1 Peter 5:8. Make sure to have character discussions in your home. Learn to praise proper character in your children (This may be the most important point.) Proverbs 27:21. Generally, we do not praise our children or we tend to praise the wrong things - like beauty and achievement, which develops pride. Praising character in your children develops their accomplishments further without building pride.

HALL-USE REVIEW COMMITTEE

POLICY FOR GUIDELINES GOVERNING THE RENTAL OF THE CUTHBERT PILGRIM MEMORIAL (CPM) HALL ON SUNDAYS

- ❖ The CPM Hall will be available for rental between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m.
- Preparation for the event will take place on Saturdays, where possible.
- ❖ Any preparation to be done on Sundays will take place before 8:30 a.m. or after 1:00 p.m.
 *Exceptions to this are at the discretion of the Hall Management Committee where it is deemed that there will be minimal disruption.
- ❖ Music must be lowered by 9:00 p.m., and turned off completely by 11:00 p.m.
- ❖ Events must be concluded by 11:00 p.m. but clean-up will take place after each rental.
- ❖ The event will not interfere with the regular occurrences of Sunday School or Divine Worship.
- The acceptance of bookings on Sundays remains at the discretion of the Hall Management Committee as with all other bookings. Bookings may be accepted or refused on the basis of suitability.
 - Bookings may be refused if the date clashes with a scheduled Church event.
 - Bookings may be refused if the preparation for said event clashes with a scheduled Church event.
 - Bookings may be refused if they are deemed to conflict with the policies for the use of the CPM Hall, or to be otherwise in conflict with the principles of the Church.

The Hall Management should ensure that adequate time is available for the preparation of the Hall for a second client. Therefore, back-to-back bookings should be avoided.

The policy will be in effect for a trial period of six months after which its effectiveness will be reviewed by the Hall Review committee.

A NOTE ON FINANCE

(Extract from The Book Of Order, Part II, Chapter 9)

The Moravian Church, Eastern West Indies Province, derives its income from **Quotas** assessed by P.E.C.; **Freewill Offerings**; & **Interest from Capital Invested**The Treasurer of each congregation within the Conference is required to keep a **Congregation Account** which shall contain items of income and expenditure under the following heads:

- Income: Offerings, Congregation Cash and Sundries

No large enterprise shall be undertaken without the approval of Island Conference, Executive Board and PEC.

First claim on congregational treasury is **Quota**. Each congregation shall operate a **budget** (annually).
