2009 Regional Focus of the Decade to Overcome Violence

I am writing with regard to the Caribbean Regional Focus of the Decade to Overcome Violence (DoV) which will commence in January2009. You may recall that the decision to designate the period 2001-2011 as the Decade to Overcome Violence emanated from the Eighth Assembly of the World Council of Churches (WCC) in response to the perceived deep yearning among the peoples of the world to build lasting peace grounded in justice for the generations of the future. The goal of the Decade is to move the

Search for reconciliation and peace from the periphery to the centre of the life and witness of the church. Taking into account the multifaceted nature of violence and the variety of responses required, a key strategy of the WCC has been to highlight each year a different geographical region of the world in order to allow focus on the specific realities facing the countries in that particular area. To date, the regions which have been the annual focus of the DoV include Palestine/Israel, Sudan, the USA, Asia, Latin America, Europe and

the Pacific Islands. In 2009 the focus will turn toward the Caribbean.

The WCC decided to approach the DOV in a way that would allow for maximum involvement and ownership by local churches. No set programme of activities is offered for implementation since it is intended that the initiatives undertaken in each region would respond to the particular needs confronting that area. This presents the churches of the Caribbean with an important opportunity to heighten their strategic and concrete response to the epidemic of violence sweeping the territories of this region. The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime and the Latin America and the Caribbean Region of the World Bank in a 2007 Report on Crime, Violence and Development in the Caribbean noted that murder rates in this region – at 30 per 100,000 population annually – are higher than for any other region of the world and have increased in recent years for many countries of the region. homicide rates are 34 percent higher and robbery rates 26percent higher than countries with comparable macroeconomic conditions. In addition, the economic and social costs of crime and violence and, especially the death and injuries from youth violence, are cause for absolute concern. Intensified action by churches is necessary now more than ever.

The principal agents for the identification and implementation of activities for the 2009 regional focus of the DoV will therefore be member churches of the CCC and interested associated bodies. Churches are free to construct their own programmes and to commence planning for interventions they deem most pertinent to fostering a culture of peace in

their communities. It must be pointed out that the WCC recognizes that the goal of overcoming violence is a long term undertaking. The Decade will be judged ultimately by whether it will have led to a change of consciousness and to deepened insights into the theological, ethical and spiritual foundations of Christian action for peace. It has been explained that the impact of the DoV will not be measured by the level of violence on the ground at the end of the Decade but rather by the number of churches and associated bodies throughout the region committed to and actively pursuing reconciliation and peace-building in their respective local contexts.

It is our hope that one of the maior outcomes of the year will be that member churches - as agents of reconciliation and promoters of justice – will recognize and intensify their ministry to healing in society. In addition, we wish to propose that consideration be given to according particular attention to reconciliation and healing in Haiti, Suriname and Grenada. We hope ultimately that the year will help to reaffirm the belief of our Caribbean people in their capacity to be people of peace and that a safe and secure future built on non-violence, solidarity and respect for the inherent dignity of all persons, including one self, is possible to reclaim.

The Caribbean Conference of Churches will accompany member churches in their efforts and provide guidance and support for all that will be undertaken. Member Churches are asked to identify a DoV Regional Focus Point of Contact with whom the CCC could liaise on relevant mat-

ters throughout the year.

#### **Unity News**

All churches are encouraged to offer their own gifts to this undertaking according to their own situation and to collaborate and learn from each other. We wish to suggest that churches meet with their parish communities to set their own priorities and design their plans for the 2009 DoV regional focus having regard to the specific issues of peace building required in their communities.

### Consideration may be given to the following:

- Direct interventions at the grassroots level
- Family Life
- Education and Awareness Building
- Highlighting and celebrating positive efforts that have been made in the area of peacebuilding and violence prevention
- Special liturgical and worship events

The Caribbean Conference of curches is requesting member churches to do all they can to make this one of the main areas of focus for next year. Background information on the DoV may be obtained at

Finally, we wish to inform you that the DoV will conclude in 2011 with the hosting of the International Ecumenical Peace Convocation (IEPA) in Jamaica under the theme 'Glory to God and Peace on Earth'.

We look forward to your full support in making the 2009 Caribbean Regional Focus of the DoV a success.

#### **NEWS FROM OTHER PROVINCES**

The Mission Province of Eastern Tanzania and Zanzibar purchased land from thir own funds in Zanzibar to erect the first Moravian Church on the island. Sis. A. Swart together with members from the Moravian Church Foundation and the African regional leaders had the honour to visit the plot and commend the project to our Lord. Your continued prayers for the work of our Mission Provinces and Mission Areas are requested.

The African Region met in Tanzania to share their various ministries and to plan on common issues such as HIV/AIDS, poverty in Africa, mission work and partnerships.

The Moravian Church Foundation had their annual meeting in Dares-Salaam in Tanzania. Opportunity was also created to visit the congregations and projects.

Mission work in Sierra Leone under the supervision of the US Southern Province is progressing very well.

The groups in Honduras wish to have spiritual retreats in order to grow together and work towards reconciliation. Funding for this project is needed and the Executive is trying to solicit funds to assist them as this is their initiative.
