There were three representatives from Honduras: Rev. Isai. Granwell, Rev. Frank Goff, and Dr. Ovelio Lopez; two from Nicaragua: Rev. Cora Antonio de Smart and Rev. Gilberto Molina; Rev. John Italazyo from Tanzania, Western Province; Rev. Peter Green from Alaska; Sarah Jensen from Labrador; Rev. Brinmore Phaul from Guyana; Rev. Armando Rusindo from Cuba; Dr. Leopoldo Pixley from Costa Rica and Rev. Dr. Cortroy Jarvis from the Eastern West Indies Province. In addition, from the Northern and Southern Provinces the following participated in the Summit: Rev. Dr. Betsy Miller, Rev. David Guthrie, Rev. Judy Ganz, Loren Jendro and the Rt. Rev. Sam Gray.



The main question was, what do we have to

create what we need? The emphasis was, as a Church, one must develop and sustain what one has and do not depend upon others from the outside to sustain you. It was emphasized that sustainability in a church is when the members and its leaders fund their own responsibilities/ core biblical functions. Our research pointed us to the fact that there were no churches in the Bible that depended on outside funds for normal functioning. God never meant for church to be too hard for poor people to exist.

Sustainability means starting with inside resources.

It is not making a plan that is too big for you and then asking for money from outside. But it is a plan that fits with your resources. One has to depend on God. God works through us. The question is, **What do we have to create what we need through the power of Jesus Christ? That is Christ-Sustainability.**

Jean Johnson, a Missionary who spent 16 years in Cambodia was our keynote Leadership Summit presenter. Jean spent most of the sessions exploring the topic of Sustainability and how it can help one to develop and grow.

What is sustainability?

- Using your resources to produce something
- The capacity to cover the necessities of the organization by yourself
- To provide continuity of an organization; means of providing continuity
- When someone can survive alone
- When someone can stand on his/her own two feet

Ken Stout in the book, *Fostering Sustainability and Minimizing Dependency in Mission Finances* says, **for a Church to be sustainable it must be able to carry out its core biblical functions without relying on foreign funding or leadership. The core biblical functions include upward aspects (worship and prayer); inward aspects (discipleship, pastoring and community life); and outward aspects (evangelism, benevolence and missions).**

On the other hand Ken Stout says, “Dependency occurs when a local Church requires funding or leadership from outside of its own members in order to carry out the core biblical responsibilities of a local Church under normal, non-crisis conditions”.

The text from 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12 is very instructive. It is a very powerful message of sustainability. It says, “¹¹and to make it your ambition to lead a quiet life: You should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you, ¹²so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders and so that you will not be dependent on anybody.” This text is clearly speaking to the fact that one should move away from the dependency syndrome, instead, one must work hard to sustain him/herself. It speaks of the self respect that one feels in supporting oneself and at the same time, the respect one gains from outsiders or from those who are looking on or are observing us.

Giving is good, for when God blesses us, we ought to bless others. However, five (5) things can be said about giving:

- ⇒ Give once, you elicit appreciation;
 - ⇒ Give twice you create anticipation;
 - ⇒ Give three times, you create expectation;
 - ⇒ Give four times, it becomes entitlement;
 - ⇒ Give five times, you establish dependency.
- (Jean Johnson)

In giving, one ought not to engender the spirit of dependency, rather, one ought to seek to empower and encourage persons so that they can help themselves. It is said that, if you give someone

a FISH, he/she will eat and enjoy it, but they will always be looking to you for more fish. On the other hand, if you teach him/her to fish and assist him/her to get on their feet, they will be able to sustain themselves. They will no longer have to depend upon you.

A powerful lesson is learnt in the story of the feeding of the five thousand people in Matthew chapter 14: 14-21:

“And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick.

¹⁵ And when it was evening, his disciples came to him, saying, This is a desert place, and the time is now past; send the multitude away, that they may go into the villages, and buy themselves victuals.

¹⁶ But Jesus said unto them, they need not depart; give ye them to eat.

¹⁷ And they say unto him, we have here but five loaves, and two fishes.

¹⁸ He said, bring them hither to me.

¹⁹ And he commanded the multitude to sit down on the grass, and took the five loaves, and the two fishes, and looking up to heaven, he blessed, and brake, and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude.

²⁰ And they did all eat, and were filled: and they took up of the fragments that remained twelve baskets full.

²¹ And they that had eaten were about five thousand men, beside women and children.”

Jesus had just been ministering to them. Lives were been transformed and persons were coming out of darkness into the light of God. Many were healed of their diseases and were restored to good health.

The Disciples felt that the day had been far spent and pleaded with Jesus to send them away that they may go and buy their own food to eat. The Disciples saw a crisis; Jesus saw an opportunity for a cogent teaching moment on sustainability. It was a moment to demonstrate how we can use what we have to create what we need.

Jesus therefore asks the question, what do you have? It was quickly reported that they had only five loaves and two fishes. There was the expectation and anticipation by the disciples that Jesus would have agreed with them to send the people away empty handed, however, that was immediately dispelled when Jesus said, **bring them to me**. He immediately took Authority over them. He looked up to heaven, he blessed, and broke, and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the people. The text brings to light that those who ate were 5 thousand men, plus women and children. Assuming that each man had a wife and at least one child, it is conceivable that approximately 15000 persons were fed.

What stood out for both the disciples and the multitude and still stands out, is the fact that; **“they did all eat, and were filled: and they took up of the fragments that remained twelve baskets full”** (Matt.14:20).

Sometimes we take for granted what God has placed into our hands. We need to quickly realize that what God has placed into our hands is to be used to His honour and Glory and for the building up of His people.

In Exodus 17:5, the Lord said to Moses, “Go on before the people”. It was a time of great stress and strain for Moses as he led his people. The people complained bitterly to Moses, because they had no water. As leader,

they felt that he was responsible for every crisis they encountered. The people were ready to condemn and discard him when he got the instruction from the Lord to go on before them.

The author of “the word for today,” Caribbean Devotional says, “to be a good leader you must do two things:”

- 1) Spend time with the people. For four hundred years the children of Israel had been leaderless. As a result, they had no identity or self- worth. They had a slave mentality. So Moses often walked amongst them. Sheep gain confidence by smelling the Shepherd’s scent and know that they are well protected. Only when people feel truly valued will they value you and follow you.
- 2) Get out ahead of the people. How do you know when it’s time to move to new territory? The people murmured against Moses (Ex. 17:3). They murmured against Moses because there was no water where they were and thirsty sheep always complain. When the murmuring starts, you may have spent too much time socializing. It’s time to transition. The Lord said to Moses, **Go on before the people, smite the rock, and there shall come water out of it**. No vision is permanently stopped by lack of finances, but by lack of faith and courage and the unwillingness to step out and take risks. When you do, you will discover that God will supply all your need according to His riches in glory (Philippians 4:19).

What do we have to create what we need? One must be willing to step out of the comfort zone and act boldly. It is not so much a lack of finances or resources for God has placed much in our hands. The challenge is for us to step out boldly and claim the blessing upon which your name has been written. Too often, it is the lack of faith and courage and the willingness to step out and trust God that has kept us back.

Hymn of the Month
April - June 2013

As we continue observing within the Province our hymn of the month, for the next two months, we will give attention to the following two (2) hymns. They are:

St. Patrick's Hymn is the hymn of the month for **May** as we commemorate Trinity Sunday on the last Sunday of the month which is May 26. The recommended tune is also the set tune which is **ST. PATRICK'S BREASTPLATE**. We are mindful though that there are some

congregations who still prefer to use the old tune from the 1949 edition of the Moravian hymnal. However, that is not advisable since there have been some major changes to the text (especially in the opening verse) which will prove to be problematic with the current musical arrangement. Although this is found in the canticle section, it is not structured as a typical canticle and so can be truly considered as a hymn. As we sing the **St. Patrick's Hymn** might we be reminded not only of the Triune character of God Almighty, but also walk in the power which is given to the Church because of the God who is Three in One and One in Three. This hymn is filled with doctrinal truths that need to be imbedded within each generation of believers.

Blak Up is the hymn of the month for **June**. This hymn was written by the late Barry Chevannes, a Jamaican hymn writer. It utilizes a Jamaican expression – **blak up** – which is used to described someone who's drunk. Chevannes plays on this indigenous term and reapplies it to vividly describe the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the early believers thereby giving birth to the Christian Church. The hymn really is a retelling of the events of Acts 2.

As we continue to observe the Sundays in the Season of Pentecost during the month of June, it is hoped that this hymn will remind us of the birth of Christianity and help us to all recapture the zeal which was is given through the work of the Holy Spirit. The music and words will be distributed at a later date.

The Provincial Hymnal Committee continues to express its sincere thanks for all who see to it that the hymn of the month is observed within the congregations. As we continue to journey through 2013, we will press ahead to share with you each month hymns/songs/canticles that build us up as the Body of Christ. We also continue to crave your prayerful support as we continue the work that has been assigned to us.

Here are the words for the hymn of the month for May 2013.
