
The Main thing, is the main thing


Now one might argue that life is not so easy, especially not in our days. There is a great deal of distress, concern, and suffering. And at times we just do not

The idea that you can be a Christian and not be part of a church is one of the greatest lies Satan has persuaded millions of people in America to believe. It is a dangerous deception to believe that you can be a Christian and not be part of a local church. Second, every living stone that God puts in his house has the same opinion of Jesus that he does. If you are a living stone, Jesus isn't just a person of passing interest to you. He is the most fascinating, most desirable, most necessary person in your life.

He is your life. You feel about him the same way that God the Father feels about him. Those who are being built into a spiritual house have examined all the potential things to build life upon and have discovered that the only thing that is trustworthy is Jesus. Those whom God builds upon the cornerstone of Jesus are those who have discovered that Jesus is the cornerstone of their lives

At the end of v. 5 Peter changes his metaphor again. He says that God is building us, these living stones, into a spiritual house "to be a holy priesthood." Not only are we the stones that make up the walls of his house but we are also the priests who serve in his house. Immediately, we should think of the priests of the Old Testament to understand what this illustration means. The priests in the Old Testament were the ones set apart in Israel to take care of the temple, to offer the sacrifices and prayers to God that he required, to pray to and praise God and to teach men about God and what he requires. Peter says that all of us are priests. There is not a special class of people any longer who are different than everyone else in their access to God, their service to God, and their necessity in God's work. We don't all have the same functions. just like all the priests in the Old Testament didn't have the same jobs. However, all of us share equally in the value of our labor and contribution to the worship and service of God and man. All of us engage in the work of offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

What are the acceptable spiritual sacrifices that we offer to God through Christ? I don't have time to show you this in the Scriptures but let me give you a simple definition and then a few examples. The spiritual sacrifices we offer to God are all those attitudes, thoughts, words and actions that we have or do by faith in Jesus.

These sacrifices are not just the things we do in or for our local church. It is our whole life, all of our time, abilities, resources, words and actions lived by faith in Christ and to his glory. All of our "sacrifices" are acceptable because of Christ's sacrifice, not because they have intrinsic value in themselves. If you are a living stone through faith in Christ, then your whole life is a living sacrifice. It includes words and songs of thanksgiving and praise. It includes acts of kindness and mercy and help given to others, especially to other Christians. It is financial gifts for the support of missionaries, pastors and the work of the church. It includes the meals we eat and the leisure time we enjoy.

It includes preaching and teaching the gospel in every way that the gospel is shared. It is words of encouragement and warning and correction and comfort to one another. It is the forgiveness and acceptance we offer to one another because we have been forgiven and accepted by God. It is being a loving husband, a respectful wife, an obedient child, a fair employer, a hard working employee. It includes the work we engage in to help the poor and preach the gospel as a church. There is no part of our life together that is not included in these spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

Having a church building is a good thing, a helpful thing but not the main thing. Being built, as living stones into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ" that is the main thing.

The words recorded in Hebrews 3: 6 caught my attention recently: "But Christ as a Son over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end."

"His own house" is His congregation. The defining characteristics of the congregation of the Lord are thus trust, confidence, and hope – hope in the fulfillment of the divine promises. There is really no substitute for this!

Unity Synod 2016

The year 2016 has begun, and for the Moravian Unity it means that we have seen the beginning on an important year, namely the year of 43rd Unity Synod of the Moravian Church Unitas Fratrum (the 27th Unity Synod of the Renewed Church). It is our task to keep the Unity Synod in prayers, and it will be good to remind the congregations and the brothers and sisters, to pray for the Unity Synod during the coming months!

As mentioned already, the Unity Synod is scheduled to be on August 12th – 19th, 2016.

It is now decided that the venue of the Unity Synod is the Hilton Rose Hall Resort & Spa, Rose Hall, Montego Bay, St. James, Jamaica.

COUF #265 enunciates that the number of delegates to the Unity Synod shall be according to the following schedule:

- a) The Mission Provinces shall have one delegate each with the right to vote. The delegate and alternate shall be appointed by the Provincial Board.
- b) The Unity Provinces shall have three delegates each with the right to vote, two elected by Provincial Synod and one appointed by the Provincial Board.
- c) The President of the Unity Board shall have a seat with the right to vote.
- d) The Moravian Church Foundation shall have one delegate with the right to vote.
- e) The Bishops of the Unitas Fratrum shall have two delegates without the right to vote, elected from among them.
- f) The Unity Board may invite representatives from Unity Undertakings and Mission Areas to attend as advisory delegates without vote.
- g) In case two or more Provinces join one another to form one Province, following the merger they are entitled to send to Unity Synod the number of delegates which they had previously. At future Unity Synods, the new Province shall have three delegates.
- h) Each Province elects alternates to take the place of any delegates who are unable to attend Synod.

D. ELECTION OF MEMBERS

COUF #266. Eligible are all members of the Moravian Church of at least two years' standing, who are communicants and who have completed the 24th year of their age by January 1st of the year in which the election takes place and who possess all the other requisite qualifications for membership in their Provincial Synod. All Provinces are encouraged to consider gender equity in choosing delegates to their respective Provincial Synod and to Unity Synod.

COUF #267. Each Province represented at Unity Synod elects, according to the procedure appointed by its constitution, its delegates and their alter-nates at the Provincial Synod, if possible at the one immediately preceding the Unity Synod.

COUF #268. As evidence of election, or appointment, a statement by the Provincial Board, signed by the President must be sent to the President of the Unity Board via the Unity Office (UBA) to be laid before the Unity Synod.

The Delegates from the EWIP are Jenetta Waithe, Adrian Smith and Cortroy Jarvis.



Hymn of the Month for January, 2016 Rev. Dr. Mikie Roberts Director, Provincial Hymnal Committee.



The hymn of the month for January captures this sense of deep gratitude to God for all that God has done in the past while at the same time expresses a faith that declares that God will continue to journey with us. The hymn is *Brought safely hither by thy hand* and was written by W. L. Alexander in 1847. In our current hymnal it is #405 and the tune that has been designated is *SHOPSHIRE*.

As a community of faith whenever we gather for worship, we cannot forget that the grace of God is at work among us in our assembly. This truth somehow becomes more evident as we meet to welcome a new year during our watch night service and on the first Sunday of the year. This hymn underscores that throughout our journey in life we are constantly sustained by God. In the first two verses we are reminded of how the hand of God has guided and protected us bringing us to the house of God to worship. But even as we recognize how God has worked on our part, the next two verses prompt us to remember that as we meet we should pray both for the Church and the world. Once we maintain that proper perspective then we can be hopeful that the joy and beauty of our worship here on earth is but a down-payment of what awaits the people of God one day in the nearer presence of God.


PEC Meeting
