John Hus, a man of all seasons

The last words of John Hus were that, "in 100 years, God will raise up a man whose calls

for reform cannot be suppressed...down to the lowest classes". July 06, 2016 will mark the 601st Anniversary of the martyrdom of Hus; a Reformer, Leader, Revolutionary, Teacher, Pastor and Evangelist.

Born in Hussenitz (Bohemia), in 1369, to peasant parents, John Hus trained himself for priesthood, mainly to escape poverty. In 1396, he attained a master's degree from Charles University in Prague and two years thence, became a professor of theology. In 1400, he was ordained to priesthood. In 1404, John Hus received a bachelor's degree in theology. Inspired by the writings and teaching of John Wycliffe, he was of the opinion that the Church was supreme, not the Pope. He felt a need for reforms and modifications, to

eradicate the corruption and abuses of Roman Church. Hus also believed that each person should have a Bible of his own, in a language he can read.

Hus, along with other Bohemian leaders, initiated a decree; according to which Bohemian nation had to have three votes and the foreign nations were to have one vote. This verdict led to the evacuation of many doctors, masters and students from Prague University, in 1409, resulting in the formation of the University of Leipzig. With this, Prague University lost its international repute and turned into a Czech school. The news of the Bohemian heresy spread throughout Europe, thus isolating Archbishop Zbynìk Zajíc. John. Hus became the rector of the Czech university.

John Hus, a man of all Seasons Cont'd from Page 1

A reformer, John Hus condemned various church abuses in his sermons, leading to serious problems between him and the church. Hus directed his thoughts to the faulty disciplines and practices of the church. He discarded the practice of reserving the chalice from the laity, during Holy Communion, for the priest. He whole-heartedly accepted the practice of worshipping in the Czech language, rather than in Latin by the masses. John Hus argued that the lay man also had an important role to play in the administration and leadership of the Church and that Christ was the true head of the Church, not the Pope. His argument that Church officials should exercise spiritual authority, instead of being earthly governors, contributed to the cause of his excommunication, for insubordination, in 1412.

Pope Alexander V authorized the Archbishop to give up all the books of John Wycliffe, cancelled his doctrines and ceased his free preaching. Though Hus argued in favor of Wycliffe, all his arguments and wiles went unheard. To cap it all, Hus and his adherents were excommunicated. However, this did not stop Hus or his adherents. With the government on his side, he continued to preach in the Bethlehem Chapel in Prague, Czechoslovakia and his power increased. Hus became fearless in his allegations against the Church,

After the death of Pope Alexander V, a crusade against indulgence started, of which Hus was also a part. Hus delivered a speech in 1412, which is said to be directly taken from the last chapter of Wycliffe's book, De ecclesia, and his treatise, De absolutione a pena et culpa. He argued that no Pope or Bishop had the right to raise a sword in the name of Church. Hus was of the opinion that man attained forgiveness only by repentance. His followers burnt the Papal bulls and believed that Hus' sayings should be adhered to rather than that of Church.

The Pope ordered the Cardinal of St. Angelo to advance against Hus. Imposed under the great church ban, Hus was seized and delivered to the Archbishop. Even his chapel was destroyed. In retaliation to such cruelties, Hus appealed that Jesus Christ, and not the Pope, was the supreme judge. Though he was forced to leave Prague by Wenceslaus, his exodus did nothing to lessen the

excitement that had built already.

A council was set up in 1414, at Constance, with the aim to put an end to papal schism and reform the Church. John Hus gladly joined the council to put an end to all oppositions. It is evident from the sermons he carried with him that he went with the motive of converting the assembled fathers to his own principal doctrines. For the meeting, the Emperor Sigismund of Luxemburg assured John Hus of safe conduct, apart from his safety for the duration of journey. Taking the words of the King, Hus set off for the journey.

At the trial, Hus was charged with thirty-nine sentences, out of which twenty-six had been excerpted from his book on the Church, seven from his treatise against Páleè and six from the treatise against Stanislav ze Znojma. However, in return, Hus maintained just one argument that he would renounce himself, if his errors were proven to him from the Bible. He asked for a fair trial and some time, so that he could prove his views. Though there were several attempts to make him recant his words and views forcefully, Hus resisted all of them.


He desired only a more fair trial and time to explain the reasons for his views. If his reasons and Bible texts did not suffice, he would be glad to submit. This declaration was considered an unconditional surrender, and he was asked to confess:

- 1. That he had erred in the theses which he had hitherto maintained;
- 2. That he renounced them for the future;
- 3. That he recanted them; and
- 4. That he declared the opposite of these sentences

He asked to be exempted from recanting doctrines which he had never taught; others, which the assembly considered erroneous, he was willing to revoke; to act differently would be against his conscience. These words found no favourable reception. After the trial, several other attempts were made to induce him to recant, but he resisted all of them.

An Italian clergyman pronounced the sentence of condemnation for Hus. Even at that time, he said that he would only be convinced once he has been given proof from Holy Scriptures. As a result, he was enrobed in priestly vestments and asked to recant. Still, he refused.

HYMN FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 2016 Rev. Dr. Mikie Roberts Director, Provincial Hymnal Committee.

It is with a sense of joy that I share this great news that the hymnals have been shipped and the long journey from China to the Caribbean has begun. To God be the glory! If all goes as planned, the books should

be in the region by the end of July. For the month of July, I wish to draw attention to the hymn *Spirit of faith, be thou my guide*. In the new hymnal it is #335 and was written in 1846 by Anne Brontë. The name of the applied tune is *ARMAGH*. This hymn is just one example of the many hymns that profoundly captures and expresses spiritual truths. Yet for whatever reason, many hymns like these have remained unknown and unsung during our worship experience. One of the primary goals of these monthly articles is to address and correct this shortcoming within our congregations across the Province.

Faith is foundational to Christian living! It is so vital an ingredient in our spiritual growth that Hebrews 11: 6 states it boldly, "... It is impossible to please God without faith..." This hymn is centred on the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer. However, from the outset, it addresses the Holy Spirit as the Spirit of faith. It is within that vein that we then see a series of actions that are accomplished when we allow ourselves to be under the total control of the Spirit of faith. So when we allow the Holy Spirit to hold our hands and to be our guide as we journey through this life, the results are clearly evident: we are comforted by an abiding presence; our gaze shifts from the toils of earth to the bliss of heaven; we are empowered to live beyond the mundane experience of earth; even in the face of pain and death, we can still be joyful; and because of the guidance of the Spirit of faith, ultimately we will be shepherded to taste first-hand the joys of a heavenly home.

I pray that as we sing the words of this hymn that our faith in God will be strengthened. Might we surrender ourselves to the Third Person of the Trinity so that the work of God's Spirit will continue to be perfected in our lives. Then the world will see the results of believers who are being guided by the Spirit of faith.

The historic publication of the first Caribbean Moravian hymnal – Caribbean Moravian Praise – is near completion. Upon completion of the hard cover hymnal, each congregation will also receive a database that will contain a reference to the hymn tunes. In this database the music for the new hymns will be provided. However, in cases where the tune for the hymn is unchanged the actual music for that hymn will not be provided. Instead the database will indicate the name of the tune and the number of that hymn in the current music edition. By so doing, it is our desire that the new hymns will soon be incorporated into the congregation's hymnal repertoire since the tunes will be at the congregation's disposal.

Work on the musical edition has been ongoing and is in the advanced stages. It is hoped that its completion should be finalized within 12-16 months. The compilation of the musical edition entails giving attention to some details that are not required in the words only edition of the hymnal. For example, in addition to the authors and translators index, there must also be added an index for hymn tunes and composers as well as the alphabetical listing of the hymn tunes. Furthermore, we have to once again negotiate with international copyright holders to secure permission for the printing of the tunes for the hymns that are still under copyright.

Mindful that this process may be lengthy, the provision

of the hymn tune database will therefore serve as a temporary but necessary measure until the musical edition of the hymnal is completed.

The other component of the provision of worship material for the Province that has also begun is the production of the Liturgy Book. We anticipate that this volume will be published locally. It will contain the revised Liturgies, Litanies and Orders of Public Worship. The publication of this volume will be the second worship resource we intend to have available within the Province. We anticipate that it will follow not too long after the publication of soon to be released words only hymnal.

The final phase of the work that will be engaged will be the provision of the hymnal and Liturgy books in an electronic downloadable format. There has been numerous request for the materials to be presented in this format and we are seeking to meet that request.

However, we currently do not possess the resources (financial and human) to give attention this matter.

In summary, there are four phases to the overall mandate of the Provincial Hymnal and Liturgical Committees:

- (1) Hard copy words only hymnal;
- (2) Prayer Book with Liturgies;
- (3) Musical edition;
- (4) Electronic format of hymnal and Prayer Book.

At this, all his ornaments were taken and his priestly tonsure was destroyed. Hus was deprived of all rights and was delivered to the secular powers.

At the execution ground, Hus spread his hands and prayed aloud. After undressing him, the executioners tied his hands behind his back with ropes. His neck was tied, with a chain, to a stake around which wood and straw had been piled up, in such a way that it covered him up to the neck.

Count Palatine asked Hus for the last time whether he wanted to recant and save his life or die. Hus preferred to die and was thus, burnt at the stake on July 06, 1415.

After Hus' death, his followers known as the Hussites expanded into all of Bohemia and Moravia as a decidedly popular movement. Almost the entire population became Hussites, including many Germans. At its beginning, the Hussite movement was very dynamic both spiritually and socially. But certainly after years of warlike and spiritual struggling with powers of the counter reformation, the Hussite movement weakened inside and out. The Hussites turned to so-called Utraquism, a reformed church created with a strongly conservative character, but still one in which a serious impulse toward biblical Christianity was never abandoned.

It was John Hus that inspired the founding of the Moravian Church which started 42 years after his death.

There were many great reformers during the Renaissance in Europe. They compared the scriptures to their church's teachings and discovered significant problems. When the movement began, most of them were in the clergy of the Catholic Church, which was the only Christian Church there at that time. Nearly every one of them wanted only to "reform" the church, to get it back to the original principles, but when that effort met incredible resistance, the many Protestant churches began to form.

We thank God for bringing the Moravian Church into being. We truly thank God for using human instruments like John Hus to blaze the trail for the beginning of the Moravian Church on March 01, 1457.

Let us together as one Church declare like the song writer William F. Sherwin:

Sound the battle cry! See, the foe is nigh; Raise the standard high for the Lord; Gird your armor on, stand firm every one; Rest your cause upon His holy Word.
