The word Advance is defined as to go or move something forward, or to develop or improve something. Kingdom commonly refers to: A realm ruled by a king or queen. A realm is a commu-

nity or territory over which a sovereign rules; it is commonly used to describe a kingdom or other monarchical or dynastic state. Advance the Kingdom here is specifically referring to the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom of God is the spiritual domain over which God is sovereign.

When one examines Scripture, two definitions will suffice:

Romans 14:17 "For the Kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (through relationship with the person of Jesus).

Secondly, 1 Corinthians 4:20 "For the Kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of power".

Chris Whitely says, the kingdom of God is the increase in Jesus' government (rule) in every situation where there has been loss because of the enemy. On the other hand RT Kendall says, the kingdom of God is the rule of the un-grieved Spirit in the life of a believer. Continue on Page 2

The question is: "How does the Kingdom advance?" Two passages come to mind. They are:

Matthew 18:4 "Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" and Acts 19:20 "So the word of the Lord continued to increase and prevail mightily". In the Acts passage, the context is the transformation of Ephesus through the gospel.

Both texts from Matthew and Acts represent the increase of the rule of Jesus. The point is this: to see the government of Jesus rooted within a culture, community or city has to take root in peoples' hearts. Transformation takes place one person at a time. It means that as we seek to advance the Kingdom, we must never count out anyone for no one is beyond God's reach. In addition, we are here only through the mercies of God, not because of any goodness of ours or on our part.

The challenge is we might see the fruit of Kingdom transformation or we might not. But either way only in eternity we will see the full harvest that one act of love or a single, seemingly insignificant Spirit-led, kingdom decision can have. That's the lesson from **Heb 11:32-40**

³² "And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, ³³ who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. 35 Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection. ³⁶ Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were put to death by stoning; [e] they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated— ³⁸ the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground.

These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, ⁴⁰ since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect".

Faith is not convincing God to give us a better life or that we can escape suffering by serving Jesus. Within the life of faith there are varying experiences. Some might see fruit, while some not. Some must endure the very thing other's escape from. Either way faith is required and should be commended as is enunciated in **Heb 6:12**, "And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore".

In summary, how is the Kingdom advanced?

- 1. Love God with all your heart
- 2. Love the people God has entrusted to you
- 3. Be the best person you can be and allow your light to shine to point others to the Kingdom

I don't think God calls Christians to imitate Superman or to be Supermen, but I do think there are some parallels in our missions. We are not called to build kingdoms. We are just called to advance the good Kingdom that is already established. That is God's Kingdom. We cannot extend God's reign, but we can help people understand what it is like to live under His reign. We can invite them into the joy of God's Kingdom through our words and actions.

Hymn of the Month for January 2017



The start of a new calendar year brings hope. We enter each New Year believing and trusting in God that all of our needs will be supplied. 2017 is no different! And so for this the first month in 2017, our hymn of the month is # 622 – Father, let me dedicate. It was written by Lawrence Tuttiett in 1864. The

name of the assigned tune is **GLORIFICATION**.

There's a very simple message that is directly expressed and communicated throughout this hymn. It is — whatever God sends our way in this life should always bring glory to the name of the Lord. The writer then highlights some of the negative circumstances of the life that may come our way which can potentially leave us questioning: how is God to be glorified in such situations? The second verse raises some rhetorical questions which cause us to realize that in the same way that human parents give the best to the children, so too does God. And when we have received God's best our natural response should likewise be to glorify God's name.

The third and fourth verses further cement the idea that we are able to give glory to God in all of life's circumstances. It does so by advancing this truth: it is a life that has been surrendered to the sovereignty of God that is truly able to glorify God no matter what. The idea of surrendering is often times easier said than done. Yet the example that is held before us to emulate is that our Saviour. Christ, in surrendering his life to the will of God resulted in dying on the cross. So then our prayer should be like that of Christ – not my will but thine be done (Luke 22: 42). Yet even in his dying, God was glorified for the divine plan of salvation plan was now complete.

We stand at the start of another year. God alone knows what the future holds. Instead of worrying over the future, this hymn invites us to trust God for the future.

This hymn invites us to release ourselves into the care of the God who loves us with an everlasting love. We can be assured that once our lives are dedicated to the Lord, then whatever God sends or allows in our lives will ultimately be for the glory of God. May each day in 2017 lead us to say – To God be the glory!
