



Hallelujah! What a Saviour!

I was struck by a passage of scripture as we were going through the Holy Week reading of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is a passage I have read time and again, but this time, it jumped out in front of me, as if to say, I need to be lifted up. God impressed it upon my heart and He would not allow me to focus on anything else. The text says, "Tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the Kingdom of God before you" (Mt 21:31).

Dr. Cortroy Jarvis Some persons think that because they come to church on **Chairman of PEC** Sundays, or just because they got their child baptized, and just because they read the Bible that they have a direct access to God. These are only first impressions. They don't really matter if what I AM and what I DO on a daily basis do not reflect the plan of God for me, that is, doing the Father's will.

The Parable of the Two Sons from Matthew (21:28-32), which is unique to Matthew, reminds us of the Parable of the Prodigal Son, which is unique to Luke (15:11-32). Both talk about two sons. In both parables the son who first said 'no' found himself in the bosom of the Father, and the son who said 'yes' is ultimately outside the home of the father. This doesn't seem logical.

Often we tend to reduce the teachings of Jesus to a set of moral codes. This is an easy way out: to claim to know what is it all about, and summarize Christianity to struggling to follow that set of moral norms. In this gospel text, we could reduce the expression: 21:31) to "doing the will of the father" (Mt obeving а set of commandments. Remember, this parable is addressed to chief priests and the elders, who guard the institutional aspects of religion. So Jesus is simply inviting us to look beyond. He once again insists that religion is a matter of the mind and heart.

"In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus" (Phil 2:5).

What I find more meaningful but challenging in my own Christian life is "to put on the mind of Christ Jesus" (Phil 2:5). I think being a Christian is taking on the consciousness of Christ. I know, personally I am far from it. I must acknowledge that in many aspects of my life I am like St Augustine, I say, "Yes Lord, but not yet!" However, despite this challenge, I do not want to reduce my Christian life to a clear set of criteria in term of fulfilling rituals and obeying moral norms.

The first son in the gospel seems to represent the institutional religion. Followers of this type of religion can pay lip-service to the God who is mystery, and try to pigeon hole Jesus into their own structures. They are unable to be surprised by God. In other words, God cannot do anything new, fresh and dynamic. It is a sad commentary on such a God who is unable to heal, restore and transform at His own will. The second son stands for the "outsiders" who may be accustomed to saying 'No' to God, but responding to their inner thirst, in due course they begin a deep search for God. The point is that we need to be courageous to walk the road less travelled. The road where God would make what seems impossible, possible.

It is important to understand that the idea is not to downplay the importance of meaningful celebration, visionary leadership, and humane guidelines in the believing community. Surely, Jesus is not saying we have to say 'No' to God first and then repent. But the question is, do we use these existing structures of creed, code and cult to seek the will of God: "to allow the life of God to flow in us?"

I choose to be in the church today because I want to pursue that ideal: to take on the consciousness of Christ; to put on the mind of Christ. It is being ready for death and resurrection. Jesus was open to the will of his Father, to be an example for us, to allow the life of God to flow in him, even if that meant first going through suffering and death. Does this seem too idealistic, and not accessible to all? It seems difficult if we want to be sure of everything before we even begin the journey. On the other hand, our Christian life becomes meaningful if we open up ourselves to God on a daily basis, and keep searching. That is why we pray with the Psalmist today (25:4-5): Lord, make me know your ways. Lord, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth, and teach me: for you are God my saviour.

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Jesus is willing to breath new life into every hardened and dead heart this Easter time. It doesn't matter who you were yesterday or who you are today. As long as you are willing to submit to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, all can and will be well. To be sure of this, Jesus chose two professions that people would scoff at, tax collectors and prostitutes, to demonstrate how he is open to transforming the lives of men and women. It is even more frightening what Jesus said, "I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the Kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him" {Matthew 21:31}.

It would be a sad thing for those who do every conceivable thing in the Church; those who worship every time the Sanctuary is opened; those who call on the name of Jesus and those who profess to be children of God, miss the Kingdom for not being genuine. God cannot be hoodwinked, bamboozled or fooled. He knows our end even before our beginning. No wonder scripture declares, "Not everyone who say unto me Lord, Lord, shall enter the Kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my father who is in heaven" {Matthew 7:7}.

Jesus found the tax collectors and prostitutes worthy of the Kingdom in spite of their reputation. Why? They were willing to submit to his Lordship. So Jesus, says, they are making their way into the Kingdom of God before you. May this Easter, cause a transformation in the hearts and lives of those who have lost their way. The Cambridge Dictionary says that resurrection is, "the act or fact of bringing someone back to life, or bringing something back into use or existence: the resurrection of his political career. In the Christian religion, the Resurrection is Jesus Christ's return to life after his death." He is an awesome God. Philip P. Bliss sums it up this way in the well known hymn, Man of Sorrows:

Man of Sorrows, what a name For the Son of God who came Ruined sinners to reclaim Hallelujah! What a Saviour!

When He comes, our glorious King, All His ransomed home to bring, Then anew this song we'll sing: Hallelujah! What a Saviour!

In our first and second article we introduced the Global Moravian We gave you the history of the project, the difficulties encountered since the project was conceived, our mission, a comprehensive overview of the features of the facility and status of works with some pictures of the actual facility

This month's article provides additional pictures to show the progress of the works to date, which is now approximately 82% completed. However, we have hit a bump in the road in terms of being fully funded to complete this project. During this final stage of the project, we do not want to lose our momentum, so we would like to ask you for your urgent financial support. Specifically, please make a donation towards our goal of raising US\$375,000.00 which will allow us to complete the construction of the building as well as to furnish it.

The JEK Home will provided three distinct service components where residents will be provided with a continuum of care from independent living to adult daycare services to assisted living in a facility that will be entirely accessible and equipped to accommodate physically challenged persons.

Typically, the adult day services component will be primarily for seniors who are still active and able to live at home. Typically they will come to the center to socialize and fellowship with their friends; participate in the education programs; engage in arts and cultural activities; take day trips to places of interest, etc.

The independent living component will be the first step in the creation of a residential community for our seniors.

The hymn for the month of April is # 520 – **O Lord of Hosts, today.** It was written in 1966 by the late Sis. Ashley Clarke who was a member of the Moravian church in Barbados. The tune name **Bishop Brown** was composed and arranged by Bro. Patmore Smith in 2012 to honour the memory of Bishop Neville Brown for his years of faithful service to

his Lord and his church.

This hymn addresses the attitude that God's people ought to possess as they gather for worship. We are reminded of the words of Jesus when he said in Matthew 21: 13 that God's house is a place of prayer. Considering this truth, we must offer prayers of thanksgiving for all that God has done and will do because of God's faithfulness. As God's people we are thankful especially for Jesus Christ. Our worship together fuels our commitment to remain faithful to the call of God upon our lives to declare the Gospel. The hymn underscores too that as a community of faith our fellowship should be marked by a sincere, loving fellowship. We are confident that God hears our prayers and so the hymn ends in a doxological praise to the God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
