Celebrating the Birth of the Moravian Church

March 01, 1457 marked the beginning of the Moravian Church in Kunvald, Bohemia in Czechoslovakia. It had its humble beginnings, but since then the Church has mushroomed and spread throughout the world, empowering, elevating, enriching and

throughout the world, empowering, elevating, enriching and enlivening the lives of people everywhere. The Moravian Church has long being in the **area of Missions** and continues

to touch the life of men and women in a Holistic way. This is a church called out by God and will never die.

On March 01, 2019 we mark 562 years since our Church was established. This church has gone through many challenges, especially severe persecution at the hands of the Roman Catholic Church. Persecution forced the Moravian Church underground, but it did not die, for God had a purpose for this Church. The members, who were convinced that God had called this Church into being for such a time as they faced, were never daunted as their persecutors sought to destroy the movement. They worshipped in Caves, Bushes, in the Forest and any place that was secure enough to prevent the authorities finding out their strategy to worship their God.

They sacrificed time in the dead of the night when others were asleep to worship God. **There was a Thirst, a Desire, a Yearning to worship the living God** and like the Psalmists in Psalm 84,vs: 2, 10 they were saying:

² My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.

¹⁰ Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere; I would rather be a door keeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of the wicked.

In 1722, after the severe hounding and persecution of the Moravian movement, they rose

like a Phoenix in Herrnhut Germany, on the estate of Count Nicholas Von Zinzendorf who accommodated them on his property.

They crossed the border from Czechoslovakia into Germany.

Today we thank God for the men and women who had the fortitude, tenacity and faithfulness in God and who stood firm on Jesus Christ, in the midst of persecution, death and burning at the stake. Today, we stand on their shoulders and proclaim with conviction: "Our Lamb has conquered, let us follow Him." This is a statement that calls all Moravians to rally around our risen and ascended Lamb of God, Jesus Christ. The question is, can the Moravian Church renew and cement its witness or are there threats lurking around the corner to destabilize, dismantle, destroy and devour it?

As we celebrate the 562nd Anniversary of the founding of the Moravian Church Worldwide, one needs to ask, where is the Church and what are the opportunities open to it as it seeks to minister in these times? Can the Moravian Church continue to be effective in these challenging and changing times? If we are honest and value what God has blessed us with we would recognize that God has placed this Church in a position to maximize our gifts and talents to His honour and glory.

As a Church, we must believe that health is wealth. God's desire for His people and indeed His Church is that we prosper and be in health. In 3 John, the word of God declares: "Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth." (3 John 2). This text suggests that God is looking for a Church where wholesomeness, honesty, sincerity, justice and righteousness are the watchwords. The Moravian Church is founded on Jesus the Christ and owes its very existence to the mercies of God. The central figure around which our Church revolves is Jesus the Christ and hence our acclamation of faith in our motto, "Our Lamb has conquered, Let us follow Him".

God has blessed the Moravian Church with much property and he expects us to maximize the use of them so that more lives can be touched and won for Him. The properties ought to be used to generate income to engage in Mission, so that the poor and less fortunate, those who have been displaced, despised and rejected, those who are under employed and unemployed can be empowered and given a new lease on life. The Moravian Church must not and ought not to commit the sin of having its lands and buildings lying idle when they can generate income to promote God's Kingdom. The Church therefore has the opportunity to galvanize our members and those who are God fearing, to put their God given gifts, talents and abilities to work in the interest of the development of God's Creation, Our Church can do no less if it is going to continue to be relevant, efficient and effective.

Adjustment to the 32nd Provincial Synod Dates <u>Synod Bulletin #3</u>

recently concluded Superintendents At the Conference, it was agreed to reduce the days for the synod from July 12 -19, to July 15 - 19, 2019. This was due primarily to the projected cost involved in hosting the Synod. It was also decided that Synodals would gather together in each conference on a day set aside to convene the Synod and to receive all the reports. This will be done by video conferencing. ALL Synodals are expected to be in attendance. All Synodals are expected to arrive in Barbados on the morning of Monday July 15, 2019. The Synod Service will be held on Monday July 15, 2019 at 7.00 p.m. The Synod Communion Service and installation of the PEC will be held on Thursday July 18, 2019 at 7:00p.m.


Synodals will be hosted at 3 venues:

A final list of all Delegates and Observers must be submitted to the Provincial Headquarters on or before March 31, 2019. Please be reminded that the new Synod dates are July 15 - 19, 2019.
