for a new home, a new car, a husband and a job. Some would ask for a solution to their problems, healing for the broken hearts, restored family relationships. Some might even respond and say "My life is empty. I have no real purpose for living. I need something to fill the vacuum in my life, something real to give me a reason for living."

A new thing brought a distinctive feature in the apostle Paul's life. Those who knew Paul (then Saul) may have assumed that he had it all together, his education and his religious life. He did have a great enthusiasm to please God. He spent



much time searching for Christians to imprison. Until one day he discovered a reality that changed his life. **He had an encounter with Jesus Christ.** As he committed his life to Him, he discovered that Jesus Christ was **REAL.**

Paul describes the transformation in 2 Corinthians 5:17 – “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.”

What this verse points out is that those who become Christians become new persons. There is a distinctive transformation. They are not the same anymore – there is a turning away from the old life (*going, going, gone*). A new life has begun!

“The indwelling presence of Jesus Christ made Paul’s life genuine. “For to me to live in Christ”, he said (Philippians 1:21). He had a purpose for living. Just as you trust in God to save you, trust Him too for each day’s challenge(s). Live in vital union with Christ (Colossians 2:6).

God is ready to do a new thing for us this year, but He has to have our co-operation. God already knows every day of our New Year and our next year. He knows the joys and stresses ahead, and He is willing to lead us safely through them. Will you let Him? He knows the steep mountains we will have to climb, and He is willing climb with us. Why not invite Him?

He will not only deliver us out of our difficulties – “but will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.”


Remember He is the Lord, Our Redeemer, the Holy One, therefore He will make good every Word He has spoken.

Let us choose to walk with Him in this New Year we have been granted. As we walk with Him throughout 2018, may we learn in a deeper way the person Jesus Christ wants us to be in our daily living.

Though human leaders have much to offer, we must keep our eyes fixed on Christ, our ultimate leader. Unlike any human leaders He will never change. Christ has been and will always be the same forever. In a changing world we can trust our unchanging Lord. Hebrews 13:8 – **Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.**

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOPS

LET FEAR GIVE WAY TO HOPE

When Christ was born in Bethlehem more than two thousand years ago, it was a time of hopes and fears. Christmas 2017 is also a time of hopes and fears.

As we reflect on the Christmas narrative in the New Testament and as we reflect on our experiences of Christmases past, we come to the realization that Christmas is about more than a little baby born in Bethlehem. For Christians, it focuses on the action in that ancient City of David, but it is connected to many cities around the world and speaks to every city, hamlet and village in our world today.

Let us recall some of the fears and hopes that would have existed at that first Christmas. Mary and Joseph though upright, God-fearing people, must have feared that people would question their integrity as someone put it, "Will folks understand? Will they know that what is done is of God? What will they think of us now? What will they think of my judgment in bringing Mary here in this place under these circumstances?" But they also had hope. Hope in what God had promised because they knew the truth of what was unfolding in their lives as part of God's plan for them and for the world.

The Wise men had fears, too. Fears, that they had lost their way. Had they been misled by the star they were following. Would they be laughed out of Herod's court as fools on a silly expedition? But they also had hopes that they would find the baby born King of the Jews and would be able to present their gifts and worship him.

King Herod also had fears when the Wise Men turned up at his palace. Is it really true that someone has been born who will supplant me? What is this threat to my rule of which these people are telling me? Before the wise men appeared, Herod had hoped to maintain the security of his present position. After they had brought their shocking message of a new King of the Jews being born, he hoped in a strategy of killing all first born boys that would keep him in power.

Fast forward to Christmas 2017! Even as we think of the family of Mary and Joseph we are rightly led to think of Christmas as a time for families to be together and to share the joys of being family. It is a wonderful time for us to pause and experience the security of home and the love and unity of family.

As we hear again the story of Mary and Joseph being turned away even from the inn because there was no room for them, as we hear of Jesus having nowhere to lay his head, let us give thought to the many persons in Caribbean who have to seek lodging this Christmas as a result of the two devastating hurricanes which have visited many of our islands; let us spare a thought for families which have been dispersed as a result of these catastrophes; let us think of those who have lost so much and those who have lost everything material. Can they have anything to hope in? Yes, Jesus is the hope of the world. Therefore, let us open our hearts and our homes to some of them this Christmas even as they live in fear of what the future will hold for them. Let us share with them and with all the world that Jesus is truly the hope of the world; he can overcome all our fears and troubles not just in a spiritual sense, but in temporal existence as well.

Finally, we cannot escape that message of the angels, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace, good will toward men. As we approach this Christmas the world holds its breath in fear as the leaders of the United States of America and the Republic of North Korea threaten each other with what could inevitably lead to nuclear war. Let us hope that God will speak good sense to the actors on the world stage so that peace will reign and people will not live in fear but in hope.

This Month in Moravian History

John Andrew Buckley,

the first Moravian minister from Antigua

Over 160 years ago this month the first man of African descent was ordained in the Moravian Church. On January 3, 1856 John Buckley was ordained a Deacon of the Unitas Fratrum.

John Andrew Buckley was born on October 20, 1818 in St. John's, Antigua, as the son of John and Hannah Buckley. On December 14, 1841 he married Charity Ann Martin; together they had eleven children. Buckley became a teacher and assistant preacher in Greenbay, Antigua. The missionaries were very content with Buckley's work. Moravian bishop G.W. Westerby reported to the Mission Board: "Our out-post, Greenbay, is for the most part under his charge, and during the past half-year the work has advanced rapidly." (Letter Nov. 28, 1851). Buckley himself enjoyed his work. In 1852 he wrote: "As to myself, the longer I am engaged in the work, the more I feel the constraining power of the love of Christ, so that I desire to be spent in the service of Him who loved me, and gave Himself for me."

Bro. Buckley was a popular preacher. The chapel at Greenbay soon became too small for the number of visitors attending his services. So in 1855 Buckley raised enough money within six months to add another wing to the Greenbay chapel. Around this time the missionaries began considering to ordain him. In those years the administration for the worldwide Moravian Church (Unity Elders' Conference) resided in Berthelsdorf near Herrnhut, Germany. Bro. Westerby applied for permission from the Unity Elders in 1854 for Buckley's ordination.

18th and 19th century Moravians believed that Christ could indicate his approval of important decisions by means of the lot; for ordination and entrance into missionary service of the church

approval by the lot was needed. In Buckley's case the lot responded negatively. When the Unity Elders attempted a year later, the lot once again said "no". Finally, in September of 1855, an affirmative lot was drawn and Bro. Westerby was given permission to ordain Buckley.

On January 3, 1856 Buckley was ordained. His wife, Charity Ann, was received as an acolyte the night before. He served the Moravian Church for many more years in Greenbay. In later years Buckley seems to have had higher expectations than the members of his congregation were able to meet. He wrote in 1866: "Concerning the spiritual state of the congregation, it is to be regretted that there is so little decided piety manifested, especially among the better-instructed, namely the young, who have received a religious education in our schools. (...) They are unwilling to join the Church, from fear of its discipline." Buckley not only cared about the spiritual state of his members, he also thought it was important for them to meet their financial obligations toward the mission, which was not always easy in times of drought or unemployment. When a severe hurricane hit the island in August of 1871 more than 100 people were given shelter in the schoolroom of the Church for two weeks.

John Andrew Buckley died on December 31, 1884 in Greenbay, after retiring in 1879. Charity Ann lived until 1906, when she died on October 18th in St. John's. Although Bro. Buckley was the first male Antiguan to be ordained in the Moravian Church, two Caribbean women had this honour before him. In January of 1746 Rebecca and Maria, both from St. Thomas, were ordained as Deaconesses of the Moravian Church in Marienborn, Germany.



DO YOU HAVE A RECIPE YOU WANT TO SHARE?

Double Layered Pumpkin Cheesecake



"A great alternative to pumpkin pie, especially for cheesecake fans. Serve topped with whipped cream."

Ingredients

(4 h 10 m; 8 servings; 426 calories)

- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 1 (9 inch) prepared graham cracker crust
- 1/2 cup pumpkin puree
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 pinch ground cloves
- 1 pinch ground nutmeg
- 1/2 cup frozen whipped topping, thawed

Directions/Method

(Prep 30 m; Cook 40 m: Ready In 4 h 10 m)

1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C).
2. In a large bowl, combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Beat until smooth. Blend in eggs one at a time. Remove 1 cup of batter and spread into bottom of crust; set aside.
3. Add pumpkin, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg to the remaining batter and stir gently until well blended. Carefully spread over the batter in the crust.
4. Bake in preheated oven for 35 to 40 minutes, or until center is almost set. Allow to cool, then refrigerate for 3 hours or overnight. Cover with whipped topping before serving.

☀️ Bethlehem and **St. Philip Fellowship** joined together for a **5-minute dramatization** the work of the **Board of World Missions**, sharing on **work in Cuba, in Tanzania** among **Orphans**, and at **Star Mountain Rehabilitation Centre in the Holy Land**.

August


☀️ Bethlehem celebrated **53 years of Ministry** this year - **August 13th**.

From the Pastor's Desk

Where Should You Go When You Get Discouraged?

*Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together,
as the manner of some is.... Hebrews 10:25*

The month of January is the start of the New calendar Year. A time when we evaluate the past and make plans for the future. We take time to consider meticulously, the missed opportunities of our past and look forward to the future with new strategies. As a body of Christ, cheerfully we receive this opportunity, to wish all our families and friends in their endeavour both locally and abroad a happy and prosperous New Year - 2018!

In my reflection, I want you to reflect with me as I have observed that many people tend to skip Church and stay away from other believers when they get discouraged. Maybe you know someone who has done this. Maybe you have even done it yourself at a time in your life when you felt discouraged or depressed.

There are a myriad of reasons why people stay away from Church when they are discouraged. Perhaps they are embarrassed that their faith is not working as fast as they think it should. Perhaps they are ashamed that they are still struggling with problems they think should have been conquered long ago. They do not want anyone to know they are still wrestling with the same old problems, so they disappear from sight. They are of the opinion that people within the church are not as Christ-like as one ought to think and are no better than those who are on the outside. Perhaps they are hurt or bruised by something someone said or did - someone in the Church who has a prominent position. Perhaps Church has become too repetitive that they do not feel the joy of fellowship.

Do not let other believers discourage you. Do not describe every believer in the same way because of one; two or even more believers have done you wrong. You can still find the best in the worst of us. You can still find believers who put God first, and would ask **what would Jesus do**, and so would have your back and your best interest at heart. Do not let embarrassment or discouragement keep you away from fellowship as

God would have you – with other believers. You can draw on the strength of fellow-believers. You can benefit from their testimony. You need that encouragement and it does help to hear someone else say, “*You can do it! You can make it!*”!

That is why Hebrews 10:25 says, ‘not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is...’. The words that are used to describe ‘someone’ in this verse suggested someone who is extremely discouraged, defeated, and depressed. Maybe he/she feels depressed because it looks like everyone is succeeding except him/her. Or maybe this is someone who is simply weary from fighting very long battles. Regardless of the reason why, this word describes a person who feels left out, down, depressed, and far behind everyone else.

The moment people begin to feel like they are failing or falling short of everyone else is often the moment when Satan tells them, *Oh, just stay home from church today. You do not need to go down there with all those rejoicing people. You know that you do not feel like being with them today, so why not just stay home by yourself? You do not need them. You can just read the Bible at home.*

Satan knows that if he can get you to fall out of fellowship with other believers at the very moment when you need fellowship and encouragement the most, then he can probably keep you down and defeated. Yes, it is true that you can read the Bible at home by yourself, and you should read the Bible while at home, and by yourself. But fellowship with other believers is essential for everyone, and that includes you. You receive encouragement from other believers that you cannot get anywhere else.

That is why Church is the last place the devil wants you to go when you are feeling low. He knows if you go to Church, you will be touched by the Presence of the Lord; you will get encouraged by other believers; and in the end, you will crawl out of that hole the enemy has put you in and rise up to a place of heavenly victory.

The devil works overtime to try to tempt us to skip Church, stay home, and do something else instead. But, friend, why isolate yourself when you are in the greatest need of encouragement?

Hebrews 10:25 could be translated:

When you are feeling down and depressed, like a failure who is falling behind everyone else, that is not the time to stay away from other believers, as some are in the habit of doing....

1. When you get discouraged, where do you go for help, strength, and encouragement?
2. Has the devil successfully tempted you to stay away from other believers?
3. How can you get more involved with a faith community that can give you needed encouragement to help you win the battles this year you have been waging last year?

SIS. ANDREA PITT, TRAINING DIRECTOR

Greetings family, friends, supports, and well-wishers! As this year comes to a close I want to share with you all that God has done through my life, and the various areas the Ministry has impacted the lives of many in this Nation, Jamaica, and several other nations.

SERVING AT THE VETERAN'S VILLAGE, LAS VEGAS

The doors were opened for me to be a part of a team to serve the Veterans in their village in Las Vegas. This was a great experience, meeting veterans and sharing love of Christ in practical ways as we painted their apartment doors, prayed with them and had great conversations, while listening to their stories.

SERVING THE DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING SCHOOL

This year, we have new leaders and new staff joining us to serve our Schools and it was a joy to walk with this group through the various areas of learning that are required as they step out to lead and shepherd students that come to us from around the world.

Each day we began with worship and a devotion allowing God to share His heart and give us His perspective for the day's proceedings. At the end of our training session, each staff received a certificate of participation, and was challenged to put into practice all that they learnt and experienced.

In September, we welcomed five students into our community for our Discipleship Training School. This School's theme is "Passion and Pursuit". Topics such as "Hearing the voice of God; The Identity in Christ; Intimacy with God and many more were taught. They are now in West Africa on outreach for the next two months. Please pray for them and their staff.

FEEDING THE HOMELESS

We believe every person must be given an opportunity to experience the love of Christ. This is why we feed those who are homeless. As we serve them a hot meal, we also sit and eat alongside of them, and listen to their stories. We share what we do in the nations and prayer with them and encourage them with the truth of God's character. Some have responded in positive ways and are eager to join us on an outreach.

HOMES OF HOPE

Over the last year we have been able to partner with six different teams to **build homes for needy families in our local communities**. The testimonies

stand out from a backdrop of poverty, often times amidst villages of poor in shacks and dilapidated roofs, a beautifully coloured solidly made home stands out like an exclamation mark. **People ask, "how did you get this house? Their answer: Jesus gave it to me!** We want to continue hearing these testimonies in the years ahead, as we seek to continue being God's hand and feet to the poor and helpless across Jamaica. Would you pray about coming with a team to help?

ANDREA'S PERSONAL PRAISE REPORT

I have been praying well over five years for a personal vehicle. I give Him praise for what He has done! 

Meeting Etiquette



Do

- **Listen**
Listen actively to what the speakers have to say.
- **Drink**
Bringing a coffee or other (non-alcoholic) drinks into a meeting is acceptable.
- **Take notes**
Taking notes helps you concentrate and process the information better.
- **Be prepared**
Read the agenda beforehand and write down what you want to address during the meeting.
- **Ask questions**
Jot down questions that occur to you during the meeting and make sure to ask them at the appropriate time.

Don't

- **Talk constantly**
Constant chatter, even if it's whispered can be extremely distracting for the speaker. You will also miss crucial information.
- **Eat**
No smelly or crunchy (loud) food. Depending on the meeting, ask beforehand if you can eat during the meeting.
- **Check your phone**
Turn your phone off or put it on silent WITHOUT vibration on. Looking at the phone while someone is talking is extremely rude.
- **Be late**
Being on time shows respect. Coming in late will distract the participants and disrupt the flow of the meeting.
- **Interrupt**
While someone is talking, don't interrupt them. Wait until they have finished before you raise your own concerns.
