From the Pastor's Desk

Pastor David Ince

“Decision, Direction and Destination”

*Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the LORD
with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your
ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.
(NRSV)*

The topic of this article was influenced by Andy Stanley’s book “The Principle of the Path” and recent discussions coming out of a workshop which I conducted. It is commended to you as we celebrate Home and Family Week, the Month of the Child, and Mother’s Day; and as we look forward to Father’s Day.

As Disciples of Christ, we are aware that our decision to make Him our Lord and Saviour in the here and now has implications for our eternal salvation. What is often missed by many during our earthly journey is the impact of our day to day decisions on the direction and quality of the journey. Although our eternal salvation is secured in the finished work of Calvary, we can often miss many blessings along the way because of our unwillingness to trust God and His direction; choosing rather to go our own way instead.

Abraham’s and Sarah’s decision to “help” God by having a child through Hagar was one which had serious ramifications for all concerned, resulting in turmoil within the household. As a part of a family, whether natural or spiritual, we ought to be aware of the impact our decisions can have upon the direction of the other members. There was the avoidable conflict between Ishmael and Isaac, and the resulting hostilities between Sarah and Hagar, which led to the latter being exiled, and it all was caused by that one bad decision.

As disciples, our decisions are to be guided by our trust in God, our direction ordered by His Word, guided by the Holy Spirit to the destination prepared for us both here and for eternity. Bad decisions always lead in a wrong direction, resulting in an incorrect destination. Let us, rather, trust God to guide our thinking so that our decisions will be in accordance with His Word; and our way may be guided by its Light to the destination prepared for us.

Provincial Synod 2003 in Barbados

The 27th Provincial Synod of the Moravian Church - Eastern West Indies Province met at Duncan C Moore Educational Centre of the Sharon Moravian Church in Barbados during the period August 10-20, 2003. The Synod began with a Retreat for all participants on Sunday, August 11th, led by the two Bishops in the Province, the Rt. Rev. Dr. Kingsley Lewis and the Rt. Rev. Neville Brown. Their presentations, both based on the Provincial theme, were respectively, **"Submitting To Christ In Service"** and **"Power"**.

The Synod **Opening Service** was held at the Calvary Moravian Church at 7:00 pm on Monday. The Sermon, based on the Provincial theme **Submitting To Christ In Service**, and using as text 1 Chron.4:10, was preached by the out-going Chairman of PEC, the Rev. Roslyn Hamblin.

A **Lovefeast** was held on Moravian Memorial Day, Wednesday, August 13th, commemorating the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the ancient Moravian Church and the birth of the Renewed Moravian Church. This service took place at the Sharon Moravian Church.

A **Reception** was hosted by the Barbados Conference on Friday, August 15th. The Reception was held at the Cuthbert Pilgrim Memorial Hall of the Bethlehem Moravian Church.

Synodals were treated to a **Tour and Picnic** on Saturday, August 16th and were hosted by families on Sunday, August 17th, after attending services throughout the Conference.

An **Ordination Service** for ordinands Sis. Vera Waithe and Bro. Adrian Smith was held on Sunday evening at 6:00 pm at the Calvary Moravian Church. This service saw the presence of members of the Cana Moravian Church in Antigua, the congregation where Bro. Smith was at the time serving. Both Bishops Brown and Lewis officiated at this Ordination, with Bishop Lewis preaching the sermon.

The **Closing Service** of Holy Communion was held on Tuesday, August 19th, at the Sharon Moravian Church. Both Bishops presided and Bishop Brown preached the sermon.

The **Chairman of Synod**, elected on the first day was the Rt. Rev. Dr. Kingsley Lewis, with the Rev. Dr. Conrad Spencer as **Vice-Chairman**. The Rev. Earl Goulbourne, fraternal delegate from the Jamaica Province, was appointed to fill the vacancy of Vice-Chairman upon Bro. Spencer's early departure from Synod. Rev. Selvin McMillan was elected as Secretary to Synod, but upon his illness and hospitalisation, his deputy, the Rev. Algernon Lewis, was appointed to the substantive post, and Sis. Beverly Job was appointed to serve as **Assistant Secretary**. The Rev. Willard Prout served as **Chaplain to Synod**.

Before adjournment, the Tobago Conference invited the Synod to convene its next meeting in the year 2006 in Tobago.



Symbols associated with Children and Eastertime



By 549 AD, paper **Kites** were being flown and it was recorded that the paper kite was being used as a message for a rescue mission. One writer says the kite symbolises redemption and dignity. The kite also symbolises the quest for freedom in man, as a bird in flight. Interestingly, the supporting structure of a kite features 'A Cross'.

The story of the **Easter Bunny** is thought to have become common in the 19th Century. Rabbits usually give birth to a big litter of babies (called kittens), so they became a symbol of new life. Legend has it that the Easter Bunny lays, decorates, and hides eggs as they are also a symbol of new life.



Eggs in particular are a clear symbol of rebirth and fertility. So, it may not seem surprising that Easter Eggs are often associated with Easter – a Christian festival that celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. ...The origin of Easter Eggs starts in Medieval Europe, but it may or may not have originated with Christians.



Celebrating The Family

May and June are traditionally the months in which Barbados celebrates the human Family. In May we celebrate Mothers on the second Sunday of the month – this year it will be May 12th. For some time now the entire month of May is also celebrated as Child Month. June offers a Special Day for celebrating Fathers – the third Sunday of the month. On each occasion celebration takes place at the national level, within the home and at the community level as well - and as we celebrate Mothers and Fathers we focus on our children as special gifts from our Creator God. As we celebrate our children, parents are celebrated as God’s special gift to children – the entire family is celebrated.



A Family is defined as a unit comprised of a mother and father, and their children. The human family provides many areas of development for each member of the unit, and not only their offspring. Such areas include survival through provision of shelter from the elements, clothing to protect or adorn the physical body from damage by environmental elements peculiar to the specific local community (ie: heat or cold, windy or dusty, even desert conditions).

The family also provides education to their offspring in learning how to manage their environmental and social needs and expectations. These are learnt through the direction, guidance and communication of the adults - parents and other significant members of the family and community (eg: grand-parents, neighbours, and the Christian family).

The Christian Family guides their children based on the Holy Scriptures, especially the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20: 1-17), and the ‘Love Passage’ (1 Corinthians 13). These guidelines help the family to live together in love, peace and harmony within their home and community, helping them to adjust to all stages and phases of life.

Let us thank God for our families, and the blessings they each bestow on our lives, our homes, and on our society – Barbados.
