

Some Business Meting Etiquette/Rules

Free of distractions

- Switch your mobile phone off or to silent, without vibration on. Do not keep your phone on the table-top during a meeting; it can be distracting if it starts lighting up, moving around, or making noises.
- Avoid checking your email and text messages. Leave the room if you absolutely must take the call or return a text.

Value Time

- Make notes in your booklet on the agenda, reports and statements beforehand on what you wish to address, and then ask at appropriate times.
- Contact each report-author prior to the meeting with any corrections or suggestions so they can be raised upfront in an orderly manner.
- During the meeting use the microphone, and speak clearly so that everyone hears what you are saying to avoid being asked to repeat.
- Be concise. Be relevant. Say what you need to say in as few words as necessary. Avoid repeating yourself or others unnecessarily, or providing unnecessary information.

Be respectful


- Demonstrate mutual respect and value the strength of diverse input.
- Always address the chair. Raise your hand and wait to be recognised by the Chair before speaking.
- While someone is speaking, even if you disagree strongly, it is impolite to interrupt.
- Listen actively to what the speaker has to say. Chatter, even if it is whispered, can be distracting and cause you and others to miss essential information. Wait until they have finished before raising your concerns.
- Let your comments be meaningful to add value. If you disagree, propose a solution.

Miscellaneous

- Stand when you are being introduced. Standing helps to identify you to those less familiar with your name.
- What has been discussed as confidential should remain confidential after the meeting is over.

First Sunday In Advent – Birthday Celebrations



December 1st was the beginning of the Advent Celebrations leading to the coming of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ in the form of a babe in Bethlehem in Judea.

In celebrating this day this

year, the Bethlehem congregation also celebrated with

Some of our specially invited guests, who joined with us on this day, accepted the invitation and fellowshipped with us at Lord's Table. Prepare to beat the January Financial Blues

Does your bank account have a holiday hangover? Here are some financial tips to help get you through Janu-worry.

Instead of just lying awake at night worrying about how you will cope, or running up more debt at exorbitant interest rates, there are some positive steps you can take right away to help make ends meet:

- "Get real" about your financial situation. Get your bank statements and find out exactly how much money you have available for January. Then make a list of your essential or fixed monthly payments (like your rent, car repayments and insurance premiums), and a separate list of variable expenses.
- Pay the minimum amount required on all your fixed expenses, and your credit card account.
- Pay attention to your variable expenses list and see where you can cut costs, because this is where the money will hopefully come from to cover extras. (Eg: you might decide to reduce your cell-phone usage, cut out take-aways and restaurant meals in January; organise a car-pool with work colleagues; cash in any "points" you have built up on store-cards and rewards cards over the past year; and avoid any additional commitments like a new gym subscription until later in the year.)
- Buy only what you absolutely need right now.
- Make sure you always compare prices, even on relatively inexpensive items. Lots of little savings can add up to quite a big amount.
- You might be able to take on a part-time second job, or work on a "side hustle" (eg: start a Kitchen Garden project) that will benefit you all year round and bring in extra income that you can allocate specifically to paying off your debts.

Some Burglary Prevention 7ips

Most burglaries are committed when the home are left unattended. These culprits are mainly opportunists and

they will take advantage of an easy target. Don't make it easy for them.

- ❖ Install solid doors. Outside doors should be metal or solid hardwood and at least 1³/4 inches thick. Frames must be made of equally strong material and each door must fit its frame securely. A door chain and/or a peep hole can be considered.
- ❖ Homeowners should consider erecting gates to their garages. Keep garage doors closed and locked. Lock away securely all garden equipment, tools and ladders. Keep hedges low.
- Secure sliding doors and windows. Cut a broom handle to the length of the bottom track so that the window or door will not slide open when forced. Also, drill one hole through both casing and sliding window, and insert a nail or pin. Ensure louvre windows are properly secured. For additional security at these windows, consider installing burglar bars.
- Secure sash windows. To prevent wooden sash windows from being pried open, drill a downward sloping hole into the top of the bottom window through and into the bottom of the top window and insert a pin or nail.
