

From the Pastor's Desk

Commemorating the martyrdom of John Hus

On July 6th annually Moravians commemorate the martyrdom of John Hus (also spelt John Huss). His death occurred in the year 1415. Hus, a priest in the Roman Church of his day in Czechoslovakia, spoke out against the corruption he noticed creeping into the church. One notable example was the sale of indulgences, which was really written notification that priests sold to persons indicating that their sins had been forgiven. Hus contended that no man, not even a priest, could forgive sin; only God had the authority and capacity for such. Instead of reform in the church, Hus' actions resulted in excommunication and exile for himself, and eventually he was condemned to death, and burnt at the stake in a meadow at Constance. But his teachings lived on in his followers. Eventually, such followers formulated themselves into a church in 1457. This church became

known as the Unitas Fratrum (Unity of the Brethren), later to be nicknamed the Moravian Church.

John Hus dared to stand by his Christian conviction, even at risk to his own life. He refused to be swayed by the popular practices of the day. He stood up and spoke out for that in which he believed. He could easily have hidden himself from execution by staying out of the view of the authorities. But that would have meant 'blending in' and accepting the practices which he knew to be erroneous. Hus therefore opted to stand on the side of truth. He understood that which Paul promoted to the church at Corinth - "live by your Christian conviction; do not merge with the way of the world" (*see set reading for John Hus Day – 1 Cor.1:18-25*).

As Christians we are called to live by the principles we espouse. We must recognise, as "Paul said to the Corinthian Christians, that "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (2 Cor. 5:17) Jesus desires of us that though we be 'in the world', we be not 'of the world' (see John 17:14-19). Jesus prayed that the church be kept pure. He prayed for us, His followers, to remain untainted by the world. John Hus understood that concept and lived by that maxim. Of the Word of God, he once said, and maintained as his motto, **"Seek the truth, hear the truth, learn the truth, love the truth, speak the truth, hold to the truth and defend the truth to death, for the truth will free you."**

As we commemorate the martyrdom of John Hus, we are called to find and follow the truth of God's Word, to remain untainted by the world, and to be uncompromising in our Christian conviction. How far would we go for Christ and His gospel? Like Hus, we are called to consider our response to this question.

Moravian History

The Martyrdom of John Hus


Recognising that the Church was slipping into corruption, John Hus, himself a priest in Bohemia, advocated reform in the Roman Church and in his sermons, often preached from the Bethlehem Chapel in Prague, he was not afraid to denounce sin of any kind or from any quarter. But his efforts at reform were met with much resistance from the Church. There were five (5) main point of concern about which Hus taught.

- That the sale of indulgences was iniquitous.
- That the Laity should be allowed to receive the cup at the Lord's Supper.
- That worship should be conducted in the language of the people.
- That Christ alone should be recognised as Head of the Church.
- That the authority of the Bible should take precedence over the authority of the Church.

He also promoted that the Bible should be in the language of the people so that they could read it for themselves.

Rather than seeing reform, Hus was excommunicated and exiled. He was summoned to a Council at Constance in Germany to defend himself, but this trial was a farce. He was dressed in his priestly robes and ordered to recant. When he refused to recant his robes were torn off; a communion cup was placed in his hand and snatched from him by a bishop. Thereafter he was condemned to death.

On July 06, 1415, date also believed to be his birthday, he was led to a meadow in Constance, and tied to a stake, bound with wet ropes. He was given one last opportunity to recant, to which he responded: "I shall die with joy in the faith of the gospel which I preached." He was burnt to death and his charred skeleton was broken up, and further burnt until only ashes remained. The ashes were then thrown into the Rhine River so that no one would be able to find anything which might be kept as a relic of the man. But John Hus (also spelt Huss) had become a Christian martyr, the fore-runner to the reformation movement, the inspiration to the establishment of the Moravian Church, and a national hero. A monument to his honour *in 1915 (quincentenary of his death) in the city of Prague.*

Preparing for In-Person Worship

In preparing for in-person worship, a number of measures were taken.

- A Committee was established to examine, assess, and strategise for the physical implementations for in-person worship. The committee comprised of Sis. Pamela Holder, Bro. Victor Nelson and both Pastors
- The Ministerial team organised a webinar online to allow for two-way communication on the matters of health and safety which impact us all
- A work day was set for Saturday, July 4, 2020 starting at 7:00 am
- Appropriate signage, touchless dispensers, non-contact thermometers, hand sanitisers, attendance log, etc, were organised
- Ushers and technicians were coordinated, working towards a rotation system
- Our Health and Safety Protocols were circulated via e-mail, WhatsApp and FaceBook ahead of the first In-Person Service

Even as we fellowship both online and in-person, we must continue to pray for the sick and persons who are afraid or anxious, for our public health officials, doctors and researchers, for child-care and elderly-care givers, for the families with reduced workforce members. As followers of Christ, let us reflect Him - demonstrating hope, faith, love. Let us continue to support each other through prayer and other tangible means.

Webinar Health and Safety Protocols

The webinar sought to provide some basic practical guidance to aid in the COVID-19 risk management process specifically for the Church and for individuals, to facilitate access to reliable information sources, and to allow for two-way communication where members can share personal knowledge - expertise and/or experiences; and ask questions while having the benefit of knowing that a trained professional is on the other end to respond.

The facilitator spoke to protocols and activities, whilst recognising that from her discussions with the Pastoral team, the Church seemed already ahead of the curb in their preparations.

During the presentation she reinforced the recommendations outlined by the Government of Barbados in relation to enhanced hygiene protocols. Ms. Joseph also stressed the need to stay informed from reliable sources - stay current, update as relevant, and communicate. She shared a number of beneficial Resource Materials.

In the Question and Answer section, members raised questions, and also shared experiences and observations.



Work Day at Bethlehem and Faith

Work day at Bethlehem and Faith not only addressed the buildings and its facilities, but also the grounds. Members were invited to come at various times from 7:00 am to assist with:

- clearing the grounds
- deep cleaning of the sanctuary - Tables, pews, handles, window winders and sills, door knobs, light switches, remote controls, etc..
- removal of cloth coverings
- sanitising of bathroom facilities

Volunteers also assisted with erecting signage, repositioning seating, and addressing other logistics

This day also provided a great opportunity to test the protocols to be put in place (temperature checks, physical distancing, attendance register, etc.).



Bethlehem's In-Person Worship experience since National Shut-down

By July 5th, 2020 all Moravian Church in the Barbados Conference reopened for in-house worship. Bethlehem Moravian Church made preparation beforehand and circulated a poster clearly defining the protocol that should be followed. I must say I was totally impressed when I arrived and saw that all measures put in place were stringently adhered to. All persons came with their masks in place and willingly complied with the ushers.

The ushers welcomed us, took our temperature, directed us to sign the register, to place our offering in the box provided, and they sanitised our hands. The labels and marking directing entrances and exits, and seating were all neatly placed.

It was nice to see some members once again although we had to distance our social activity to a wave. This first Sunday in July is a day of significance for the Moravian Church worldwide. The service and sermon were focused on John Huss and his loyalty to Christian principles, which led his martyrdom, but also led to starting the Moravian Church. Most enjoyable was a recorded version of The Moravian Disciples singing "Rally around the Lamb". We have to uplift them in our prayers as they continue their good work in song.

Faith's In-Person Worship experience since National Shut-down





It's Summer: Fun is Important, but Safety is Paramount!

Here are some tips to help as we navigate this unusual Summer with an historic pandemic still around us. Whether a beach trip or road-trip or other, these tips will help us make it a safe occasion for all parties.

Plan each activity in advance

Before you drive off into the sunset, know your specific plan:

- Where will you go
- How will you get there
- Emergency Medicine supplies
- Where will you stay
- What will you do when you arrive
- Are you comfortable using public restrooms
- Do you have ample disinfecting wipes and masks
- Where will you eat

Do NOT be shy about being thorough

Know before you go! Call ahead to any place you plan to go/visit.

- Ask the manager how they are ensuring public safety - whether they are reducing the number of people to help prevent the spread of the corona virus.
- Ask about the cleaning protocols in place.
- Ask if staff and guests are screened for the virus.
- If you have to travel abroad, ask if there are any quarantine requirements, and how that is handled.

Carry out your own research

Research places online and read recent reviews.

- Do you see any reports about too many people gathered at this facility, or not wearing masks?
- Does this destination have reduced hours and, if so, what are the new hours.

Travel with several masks

- Masks are required in every public area, and when outside with others but not able to adhere to physical distancing.
Remember, masks should not be worn for more than three (3) hours at a time. Once removed, replace with a clean new mask.

Do NOT neglect to communicate with every member of your family

Communication is key!

- Speak with every member of the family travelling with you.
- Make sure they understand that while it will be a fun-trip, it will not be their typical summer vacation trip as may have been enjoyed in the past - but a new norm!

It's important to get enough sleep the night before your exam. It will be easier to focus if you are well rested.




Get organised

Give yourself plenty of time to get to the venue; you don't want to be in a rush before the exam.



Drink water

An easy way to improve your concentration is to stay hydrated, so remember to bring a bottle of water to the exam.



Stay calm

If you find yourself getting nervous, take some deep breaths and feel your body relaxing before you move on to the next question.



Read the question

Don't rush through the exam. Make sure you read each question at least twice before writing your answer.



Leave time at the end

Make sure you leave time at the end of the exam to check your answers.
