From the Pastor's Desk

Rev. N.C. Roslyn Hamblin Worldwide Communion Sunday

The first Sunday of

October is celebrated in many denominations in many parts of the world as Worldwide Communion Sunday. It focuses on the fact that it is one Jesus Christ who died for us all, thus forgiving us of our sins and calling us to forgiveness and unity.

When we participate in Holy Communion:

- we commemorate the last supper Jesus held with his disciples, when he said: "This is my body which is broken for you . . . this cup is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:19-20);
- we remember the sacrifice, which Jesus Christ made for us by giving his life so that we may live freed from sin and justified, redeemed and saved;
- we renew our fellowship with the Lord and with each other,
- we anticipate the Great Feast in the Lord's presence in glory.

We believe that it is the Lord himself who invites us to eat and to drink and who shares with us, and we trust that He is present in a special way.

We thank God, that he has counted us worthy to stand before Him, but at the same time we do our part to prepare ourselves for this solemn feast. In earlier times such preparation was done at "Speaking" before the Pastor. Today each is called to prepare for Holy Communion for himself/herself.

As you prepare to participate in the Lord's Supper, you should, as far as possible,

- clear all that might stand between you and the Lord by confessing your sin (see "prayer for private confession", pg. 49).
- seek reconciliation with your neighbour that nothing stand between you and your brother/sister when you go to the Lord's Table (represented by the first handshake).

Many churches around the world therefore participate together in the Lord's Supper on this one day, showing our unity in Christ and promoting ecumenical co-operation. Let us then use the second handshake as token of our corporate vow to serve our Lord.

Come, approach the sacred board 'Tis the supper of the Lord



Our Mission Festival

"A Call to Advance the Kingdom"

The Mission Festival service was held on Tuesday September 17th, 2019; our preacher for the occasion was the Rev. Suzanne Ellis of the St. Augustine Anglican Church. Rev. Suzanne, in her charge to us under the theme "Advancing the Kingdom – Sharing the Word", borrowed from the text Matthew 28:16-20 where Jesus commissioned His disciples to go preach and teach the Word. We were reminded that this is the responsibility of all believers, and not a select few on certain occasions. The advancing of the Kingdom is an on-going activity and we were commended as a denomination for the work we are doing here at home and throughout the Region, including the missions to Grenada and Tortola. But she cautioned us not to rest on our laurels as the work continues.

All who attended were encouraged to play their part, and many voiced how blessed and heartened they were to be a part of this mission service and wished that more could have shared in the experience.

The financial report showed a significant improvement over last year, and was only short of the target by approximately \$600, a gap, which our treasurer expected, would be closed and surpassed by the end of the month. As a congregation, key areas of mission this year will be the Gracehill Preschool and the Calvary Feeding Programme. As Rev. Suzanne encouraged us, we are to keep advancing.

Crops are Lettuce, Thyme, Flavoured Peppers, Hot Peppers, Sweet Peppers, Okras, Cucumber, Cassava (new), Pigeon Peas (new). This work is undertaken by Bro. Earl Alleyne and Sis. Enid Harris, and encouraged and supported by Sis. Analacia Yarde and Sis. Margaret Harris.

The Garden not only provides physical food, but is a platform for outreach to members and the community – an avenue for demonstrating good stewardship. The Word of



God urges us that in the same way we sow physical seeds and nurture and yield physical food in our own gardens, we are called also to "Go" and join hand in hand with Him to sow spiritual seeds. We Gatherin'

Every year our Island Council of Women's Fellowship hosts a competition of Arts and Crafts among the Women's Fellowship Groups of our Moravian Churches in the Barbados Conference. For many years the Island Council of the Moravian Women's Fellowships in Barbados have engaged in this celebratory activity which showcases the skills of our women and their creative use of resources, our imagination, and in recent years our recycling capacity. Categories have expanded. Prizes are offered and trophies acquired.

Throughout this year as a Church we have been challenged to 'keep advancing'. As time passes with this annual celebration, as with other areas of our ministry, improvements must be a continual feature. I would like to suggest areas for continuous improvements with our Arts and Crafts competition. In our culinary arts category, we should seek to focus on the utilisation of our local products such as fruits, ground provision (ie: cassava, sweet potatoes, yams, carrots, beets, cauliflower, beans/peas, spinach, celery). Also, our focus should be on encouraging our young people to get involved in the Women's Fellowship activity generally, but also specifically in this area which could prove to be an entrepreneurial avenue for economic development (businesses) - an area where we would also be paying attention to utilizing the resources which God has provided for us in this our special environment.

As we focus on 'Advancing the Kingdom' and developing and empowering our people in this area, there are resources which are available to us. We have the culinary section of the Samuel Jackman Prescod Institute of Technology from which we can draw our training resource personnel, as well as the Small Business Association (SBA) of the Barbados Industrial Development Corporation (BIDC) to guide our members in areas such as packaging and health requirements.

After the many years of our annual Arts and Craft Exhibition, it is prudent that we plan to move to the next development level; with God's help and direction. As Bethlehem brings to a close the Conferences Harvest Programmes next month, and as together we prepare to celebrate our Nation's 53rd Anniversary of Independence, this is a good time to place emphasis on this type of development. Christmas

will be soon upon us, as well as our national focus for 2020 – "We Gatherin", so let us give our overseas Barbadian relatives a special surprise of convenience in accessing our locally prepared and packaged products – good quality, by good stewards of God's gifts. May God direct us accordingly.
