

Help us not to forget the power You hold, but to place everything in Your hands. Thank You for loving us, and for coming to earth to save us all. Hosanna – Ride on King Jesus. Amen.





Advent begins the Christian Calendar. The word actually means 'the Coming'. It is a period of four Sundays leading up to Christmas. It therefore focuses on the coming of Jesus Christ into the world. Within the church it is used as anticipation of Christmas and preparation for it.

The First Sunday of Advent is often referred to as 'Advent Sunday'. Because it focuses on the coming of Christ to earth, His mission of salvation also comes into focus. Hence the Triumphant Entry of Christ into Jerusalem, with the crowds shouting Hosanna ('Save now'), becomes a focal story for the occasion. Consequently, the Hosanna Anthem is sung in Moravian congregations on this Sunday. (The other occasion for singing the Hosanna Anthem is Palm Sunday.)

The focus of the Second Sunday of Advent is the Second Coming of Christ. On that occasion He comes as a Judge and not as a baby. His focus then is not on saving the world but on gathering the saved for eternity with the Lord. The service on the second Sunday of Advent therefore tends to focus on preparation for His return. This may be seen in the Litany for that Sunday, the scripture readings set and the hymns selected.

During the Advent Season you are therefore called upon to reflect on the Return of Christ and your readiness for such a return. Matthew 24:27-44 is a succinct description of the scenario of Christ's return. One songwriter, in speaking about this event, concludes by saying "I wish we'd all been ready". It is, indeed, very important to be prepared and ready for that event.

The Third Sunday of Advent focuses on the work of Jesus Christ in the world whilst He lived on earth. The service on that Sunday therefore tends to focus on the life of Jesus and His activities on earth. Thus the Litany for the Third Sunday in Advent highlights activities of His life on earth, as may the set scripture readings and the hymns.

The Fourth Sunday in Advent focuses on the announcement of Jesus as the Christ. The service

therefore highlights the fact that the Lord has come as the light to the world, bringing with Him peace. The world is thus called to rejoice in Him. Hence the Litany for the Fourth Sunday in Advent emphasises the proclamation of Jesus as Lord, as may the set scripture readings and the hymns.

As we prepare towards Christmas, may we recognise the Christ we celebrate, and give Him the honour that is due to Him for all that His Coming has meant for us. May we also claim the Salvation He came to bring, live in His Light and according to His example, and prepare ourselves for His return as Judge.

May yours be a productive Advent, a Blesséd Christmas, and a New Year filled with His Hope!

EasySlides Training Workshop

Training in the operation of the EasySlides was undertaken on Saturday, September 7th. The training was facilitated by Sis Jeaneta Waithe and Bro. Mark Howard at Bethlehem. Three (3) young persons attended – two from Bethlehem and one from Faith, and were guided in the manipulation of the EasySlides. The training emphasised the discipline required to maintain focus throughout, and to be mindful of the needs, not only of the congregation/audience, but also of the persons leading the worship experience/event.

Lecture on Alzheimer's Disease, and the Symptoms of Dementia

In November the Calvary Moravian Women's Fellowship hosted a lecture on "Alzheimer's Disease, and the Symptoms of Dementia", at Calvary. The Presenter was Miss Pamelia Brereton, President of the Barbados Alzheimer's Association.

Miss Brereton pointed out that it was very important to become familiar with the signs and symptoms of Alzheimer's – which she explained was just one of the forms of Dementia. Some easily identifiable signs discussed that night included:

- Loss or lapses in recent memory, and getting lost in familiar places;
- Personality changes, and uncharacteristic mood/behaviour changes; and
- Changes in sleep pattern and appetite *(among others)*.

It was recommended that one of the first steps to take would be to seek an appointment with a General Practitioner who would rule out other potential causes and make a referral if deemed necessary, for further assessments, tests, and scans to be carried out. Social interaction with family and friends, as well as exercise and physical activity, were cited as recognised nonmedical treatments for dementia.
