From The Pastor's Desk

Bearing the Torch with Pride 13 August 2016 will mark the 289th year since the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on a disorganized, disenchanting, disheartened and disjointed Moravian Community in Herrnhut. The Community had been torn apart by infightings, jealousy, greed and a lust for power. Their division had nothing to do with their love for God and Him crucified. On 13 August at Bertlesdorf Chapel, the Holy Spirit transformed their outlook on life for good. It brought a Unity in their midst that they had never experienced before. It was out of this that the Moravians began to send Missionaries throughout the world, beginning with David Nitschmann and Leonard Dober in 1732 in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, formerly Danish West Indies.

A Moravian historian wrote that Church history abounds in records of special outpourings of the Holy Spirit, and verily the thirteenth of August 1727 was a day of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We saw the hand of God and His wonders, and we were all under the cloud of our fathers baptized with their Spirit. The Holy Ghost came upon us and in those days great signs and wonders took place in our midst.

He continues that from that time scarcely a day passed but what we beheld His almighty workings amongst us. A great hunger after the Word of God took possession of us so that we had to have three services every day, viz. 5.00 and 7.30 a.m. and 9.00 p.m. Every one desired above everything else that the Holy Spirit might have full control. Self-love and self-will, as well as all disobedience disappeared and an overwhelming flood of grace swept us all out into the great ocean of Divine.

The Moravian brethren had sprung from the labours and martyrdom of the Bohemian Reformer, Jan Hus. They had experienced centuries of persecution. Many had been killed, imprisoned, tortured or banished from their homeland. This group had fled for refuge to Germany where the young Christian nobleman, Count Ludwig Zinzendorf, offered them asylum on his estates in Saxony. They named their new home Herrnhut, 'the Lord's Watch'. From there, after their baptism in the Holy Spirit, they became evangelists and missionaries.

Fifty years before the beginning of modern Foreign Missions by William Carey, the Moravian Church had sent out over one

hundred (100) missionaries. Their English missionary magazine, Periodical Accounts, inspired William Carey. He threw a copy of the paper on a table at a Baptist meeting, saying, 'See what the Moravians have done! Cannot we follow their example and in obedience to our Heavenly Master go out into the world, and preach the Gospel to the heathen?'


That missionary zeal began with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Count Zinzendorf observed, "The Saviour permitted to come upon us a Spirit of whom we had hitherto not had any experience or knowledge. ... Hitherto we had been the leaders and helpers. Now the Holy Spirit Himself took full control of everything and everybody".

One result of their baptism in the Holy Spirit was a joyful assurance of their pardon and salvation. This made a strong impact on people in many countries, including John and Charles Wesley, who later championed the establishment of the Methodist Church.

In 1736, John and Charles Wesley sailed to America as Anglican missionaries. A company of Moravian immigrants was also on the vessel. During a terrible storm, they all faced the danger of shipwreck. John Wesley wrote in his journal: "At seven, I went to the Germans. I had long before observed the great seriousness of their behavior. Of their humility, they had given a continual proof by performing those servile offices for the other passengers, which none of the English would undertake;

for which they desired and would receive no pay, saying, 'It was good for their proud hearts', and 'their loving Saviour had done more for them'. And every day had given them occasion of showing a meekness, which no injury could move.

If they were pushed, struck or thrown down, they rose again and went away; but no complaint was found in their mouth. Here was now an opportunity of trying whether they were delivered from the spirit of fear, as well as from that of pride, anger and revenge.

In the midst of the Psalm wherewith their service began, the sea broke over, split the mainsail in pieces, covered the ship and poured in between the decks, as if the great deep had already swallowed us up. A terrible screaming began among the English. The Germans calmly sung on. I asked one of them afterwards: 'Were you not afraid?' He answered, 'I thank God, no'. I asked: 'But were not your women and children afraid?' He replied mildly: 'No, our women and children are not afraid to die'.

In Georgia, John Wesley sought spiritual counsel from the Moravian Bishop, A. G. Spangenberg. Back in England in 1738, the Wesley brothers became intimately acquainted with the Moravians, especially Peter Boehler who later became a leading Moravian bishop.

As men and women of faith in the Moravian Church, Eastern West Indies Province, what has gone wrong? Where is the passion to pass the baton that was handed over to us? Can we say that we are still bearing the torch that fell from the hands of those who gave their lives for the cause of Christ? Can we not recapture the passion that we once had? Where is the love for God that once burned within us? I want to challenge us as we embark upon the 43rd Unity Synod in Jamaica from August 12-19, 2016, to allow the words of the song writer, Frank Houghton to reignite that fire within us. Frank Houghton, in his song, "Facing A Task Unfinished" declares:

***We bear the torch that flaming,
Fell from the hands of those
Who gave their lives,
proclaiming
That Jesus died and rose.
Ours is the same mission,
The same glad message ours,
Fired by the same ambition,
To Thee we yield our powers.***

***O Father who sustained them,
O Spirit who inspired,
Saviour, whose love
constrained them
To toil with zeal untired,
From cowardice defend us,
From lethargy awake!
Forth on Thine***

A Evening of Thanks to Pastor Elva

Resplendent in a brown, turquoise and olive green African gown, Pastor Elva Richards was ushered into the sanctuary of the Ebenezer (Estridge) Moravian Church by dancers from the Zion, Ebenezer (Estridge) and Bethel Pastorate. On Sunday 24 July 2016, an awaiting throng of members, friends and well-wishers of the Moravian Church St. Kitts Conference, other invited guests and dignitaries, sat in eager anticipation of the afternoon's proceedings. The dress code of green, African and cultural print was aptly chosen as they were favourites of Pastor Elva. Many had come to the appreciation service with mixed emotions of gratitude to her for all she had done, joy at the new opportunities awaiting her and sadness at the thought of losing her as an integral part of their congregations and the Conference.

The service was filled with songs and passages which were favourites of Pastor Elva and gave a glimpse of her love, appreciation and devotion to God. One by one, members of the Pastorate to which she was assigned as the Associate Pastor and members of the Conference expressed their love and gratitude to her. Expressions were offered through dance, music, scripture readings, words of kindness and presentation of gifts. Although most of the items were done as tributes to Pastor Elva, they were also reassuring and uplifting to those in attendance. In his sermon, Rev. Dr. Errol Connor, Vice Chairman of the Provincial Elders' Conference of the Moravian Church, Eastern West Indies Province, reminded us that life cannot be reduced to just events and circumstances, but that in all things we must trust that God always has a better plan for our lives. He said that Faith makes things possible, not easy, and that even though we become discouraged at times, we must remember that the Word of God tells us in Romans 8:28 that "...all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to His purpose". He also encouraged us to have faith in God and be faithful in ministry.

In response to the outpouring of love, Pastor Elva expressed with humility and reverence that all the glory belonged to Almighty God and that in all things she hoped for her life and ministry to reflect the words of the chorus of the hymn: **I, The Lord of Sea and Sky**.

As a Pastorate and Conference, we wish to say thank you Pastor Elva; you are loved and you will be deeply missed.

Hymn of the Month July 2016

It is with a sense of joy that I share this great news that the hymnals have been shipped and the long journey from China to the Caribbean has begun. To God be the glory! If all goes as planned, the books should be in the region by the end of July. For the month of July, I wish to draw attention to the hymn *Spirit of faith, be thou my guide*. In the new hymnal it is #335 and was written in 1846 by Anne Brontë. The name of the applied tune is *ARMAGH*. This hymn is just one example of the many hymns that profoundly captures and expresses spiritual truths. Yet for whatever reason, many hymns like these have remained unknown and unsung during our worship experience. One of the primary goals of these monthly articles is to address and correct this shortcoming within our congregations across the Province.

Faith is foundational to Christian living! It is so vital an ingredient in our spiritual growth that Hebrews 11: 6 states it boldly, "...*It is impossible to please God without faith...*" This hymn is centred on the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer. However, from the outset, it addresses the Holy Spirit as the Spirit of faith. It is within that vein that we then see a series of actions that are accomplished when we allow ourselves to be under the total control of the Spirit of faith. So when we allow the Holy Spirit to hold our hands and to be our guide as we journey through this life, the results are clearly evident: we are comforted by an abiding presence; our gaze shifts from the toils of earth to the bliss of heaven; we are empowered to live beyond the mundane experience of earth; even in the face of pain and death, we can still be joyful; and because of the guidance of the Spirit of faith, ultimately we will be shepherded to taste first-hand the joys of a heavenly home.

I pray that as we sing the words of this hymn that our faith in God will be strengthened. Might we surrender ourselves to the Third Person of the Trinity so that the work of God's Spirit will continue to be perfected in our lives. Then the world will see the results of believers who are being guided by the Spirit of faith. Below are the words and music for the hymn of the month for July:

Status Update on Caribbean Moravian Praise Hymnal

The historic publication of the first Caribbean Moravian Hymnal – Caribbean Moravian Praise – is near completion. Upon completion of the hard cover hymnal, each congregation will also receive a database that will contain a reference to the hymn tunes. In this database the music for the new hymns will be provided. However, in cases where the tune for the hymn is unchanged the actual music for that hymn will not be provided. Instead the database will indicate the name of the tune and the number of that hymn in the current music edition. By so doing, it is our desire that the new hymns will soon be incorporated into the congregation's hymnal repertoire since the tunes will be at the congregation's disposal.

Work on the musical edition has been ongoing and is in the advanced stages. It is hoped that its completion should be finalized within 12 – 16 months. The compilation of the musical edition entails giving attention to some details that are not required in the words only edition of the hymnal. For example, in addition to the authors and translators index, there must also be added an index for hymn tunes and composers as well as the alphabetical listing of the hymn tunes. Furthermore, we have to once again negotiate with international copyright holders to secure permission for the printing of the tunes for the hymns that are still under copyright.

Mindful that this process may be lengthy, the provision of the hymn tune database will therefore serve as a temporary but necessary measure until the musical edition of the hymnal is completed.

The other component of the provision of worship material for the Province that has also begun is the production of the Liturgy Book. We anticipate that this volume will be published locally. It will contain the revised Liturgies, Litanies and Orders of Public Worship. The publication of this volume will be the second worship resource we intend to have available within the Province. We anticipate that it will follow not too long after the publication of soon to be released words only hymnal.

The final phase of the work that will be engaged will be the provision of the Hymnal and Liturgy books in an electronic downloadable format. There have been numerous requests for the materials to be presented in this format and we are seeking to meet that request.

However, we currently do not possess the resources (financial and human) to give attention this matter.

In summary, there are four phases to the overall mandate of the Provincial Hymnal and Liturgical Committees:

- (1) Hard copy words only Hymnal;
- (2) Prayer Book with Liturgies;
- (3) Musical Edition Hymnal; and
- (4) Electronic Format of Hymnal and Prayer Book.

Unity Synod 2016

The year 2016 has begun, and for the Moravian Unity it means that we have seen the beginning of an important year, namely the year of the 43rd Unity Synod of the Moravian Church Unitas Fratrum (the 27th Unity Synod of the Renewed Church). It is our task to keep the Unity Synod in our prayers during the coming months!

The Unity Synod is scheduled to be held from 12 to 19 August 2016 at the Hilton Rose Hall Resort & Spa, Rose Hall, Montego Bay, St. James, Jamaica.

(Give a treat to the child you have chosen ahead of time.) Now, I have a deal for you. You can keep the treat I have given you, or you can trade it for what is in box #1. Before you make your decision, I will tell you that one of these boxes has a nice prize. The other two do not. Do you want to trade? You do? Great, give me back the treat.

First, let’s see what is in box #3. (Open box #3 to show a gag prize.) Now we know that the prize is in box #1 or box #2. You have what is in box #1, right? I have another deal for you. You can keep what is in box #1, or you can trade it for what is in box #2. Do you want to trade for box #2? You do? Great! You now have what is in box #2. First, let’s see what is in box #1. (Open box #1 to reveal another gag prize.) Great! You have won the prize! (Open box #2 and give the child the prize.)

That turned out quite well, didn’t it? Unfortunately, it does not always work that way in real life. Sometimes people go through life making deals and trying to build up more and more wealth. They think that the more money and possessions they have, the happier they will be.

Jesus warned about that. He said, “Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man’s life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions.” He then told the story of a man whose land had produced so much grain that he had no place to store it. Even though he had plenty, he wanted more, so he decided to tear down his barns and build bigger ones. Jesus said the man was a fool, for when his life was over, he would leave everything behind. He would leave this world with nothing.

Life is not a TV game show and God doesn’t make deals. God has promised to supply all of our needs, but He has not promised to fulfill every selfish wish. “Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed.”




